2	To amend and reenact R.S. 40:1131(10) and (12) through (26), 1133.1(E)(1), 1133.2(B)(1)
3	and (3), 1133.3(A) and the introductory paragraph of 1133.3(B)(1), 1133.4(A)(1),
4	(2), and (4), 1133.5(3), 1133.13(E), 1133.14(A)(2) and (C), 1135.3(C)(1)(d) and
5	(3)(b), 1135.8(C)(4)(c), to enact R.S. 40:1131(27) and 1133.3(B)(1)(f), and to repeal
6	R.S. 40:1133.3(B)(2), relative to emergency medical services; to provide for
7	definitions; to provide for the renaming of the EMS certification commission; to
8	provide for the commission's entitlement to emergency medical personnel criminal
9	history records; to provide for the removal and renaming of certain testing fees; to
10	provide for the number of voting commission members; to provide for duties of
11	emergency medical personnel; and to provide for related matters.
12	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
13	Section 1. R.S. 40:1131(10) and (12) through (26), 1133.1(E)(1), 1133.2(B)(1) and
14	(3), 1133.3(A) and the introductory paragraph of 1133.3(B)(1), 1133.4(A)(1), (2), and (4),
15	1133.5(3), 1133.13(E), 1133.14(A)(2) and (C), 1135.3(C)(1)(d) and (3)(b), 1135.8 (C)(4)(c)
16	are hereby amended and reenacted and R.S. 40:1131(27) and 1133.3(B)(1)(f) are hereby
17	enacted to read as follows:

1	§1131. Definitions
2	For purposes of this Chapter, the following terms have the meaning ascribed
3	to them in this Section:

5	(10) "Commission" means the Louisiana Emergency Medical Services
6	Certification Commission.
7	* * *
8	(12) "Emergency medical personnel" means EMS practitioners and
9	certified ambulance operators.
10	(13) "Emergency medical response vehicle" means a marked emergency
11	vehicle with fully visual and audible warning signals operated by a certified
12	ambulance service, the primary purpose of which is to respond to the scene of a
13	medical emergency to provide emergency medical stabilization or support, or
14	command, control, and communications, but which is not an ambulance designed or
15	intended for the purpose of transporting a victim from the scene to a medical facility
16	regardless of its designation. Included are such vehicles referred to but not limited
17	to the designation as "sprint car", "quick response vehicle", "special response
18	vehicle", "triage trucks", "staff cars", "supervisor units", and other similar
19	designations. Emergency medical response vehicles shall not include fire apparatus
20	and law enforcement patrol vehicles which carry first aid or emergency medical
21	supplies and which respond to medical emergencies as part of their routine duties.
22	(13)(14) "Emergency medical services" or "EMS" means a system that
23	represents the combined efforts of several professionals and agencies to provide
24	prehospital out-of-hospital emergency, urgent, preventive, and non-emergent care
25	to the sick and injured.
26	(14)(15) "EMS medical director" means a physician licensed by the
27	Louisiana State Board of Medical Examiners who has responsibility and authority
28	to ensure quality of care and provide guidance for all medical aspects of EMS.
29	(15)(16) "EMS practitioner" means an individual who is a licensed

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emergency medical responder, licensed emergency medical technician, licensed advanced emergency medical technician, or a licensed paramedic.

(16)(17) "EMS task force" means the Emergency Medical Services Task Force, composed of individuals subject to the approval of the secretary of the department, which advises and makes recommendations to the bureau of emergency medical services and the department on matters related to emergency medical services.

8 (17)(18) "Industrial ambulance" means any vehicle owned and operated by 9 an industrial facility and used for transporting any employee who becomes sick, 10 injured, or otherwise incapacitated in the course and scope of his employment from 11 a job site to an appropriate medical facility.

(18)(19) "Licensed emergency medical responder" means any individual who
 has successfully completed an emergency medical responder education program
 based on National EMS Education Standards approved by the bureau and who is
 licensed by the bureau.

(19)(20) "Licensed emergency medical services practitioner" means an
 individual who is a licensed emergency medical responder or who is nationally
 registered, who has successfully completed an emergency medical services
 practitioner education program based on national EMS education standards, and who
 is licensed as any one of the following:

- 21 (a) A licensed emergency medical technician.
- 22 (b) A licensed advanced emergency medical technician.
- 23 (c) A licensed paramedic.

24 (20)(21) "Moral turpitude" means an act of baseness, vileness, or depravity
25 in the duties which one person owes another, or to society in general, which is
26 contrary to the usual, accepted, and customary rule of right and duty which a person
27 should follow.

28 (21)(22) "Municipal nonprofit organization" means an organization owned
 29 by a parish, municipality, or entity of a parish or municipality which in its regular

4 (22)(23) "National EMS education standards" means the document that
5 outlines current nationally recognized EMS education standards, has been adopted
6 by the bureau, and defines terminal objectives for each nationally defined EMS
7 licensing level.

- 8 (23)(24) "Physician" means a physician licensed to practice medicine by the
  9 Louisiana State Board of Medical Examiners.
- 10 (24)(25) "Public safety agency" means a functional division of a public or
   11 private agency which provides firefighting, police, medical, or other emergency
   12 services.
- (25)(26) "Public safety telecommunicator" means an individual answering
   911 emergency medical condition calls on behalf of a public safety agency who has
   authority, based on a protocol adopted by the agency, to provide telephone
   cardiopulmonary resuscitation (T-CPR) instructions to a caller before arrival of
   professional medical assistance by first responders.
- 18(26)(27)"Volunteer nonprofit organization" means an organization which in19its regular course of business responds to a call for help and renders medical20treatment and whose attendants are emergency medical personnel, a registered nurse,21or a physician and which is chartered as a nonprofit organization under Section 501c22of the United States Internal Revenue Code, as a volunteer fire department by the23Louisiana state fire marshal's office, or as a nonprofit organization by the Louisiana24secretary of state.

6	A. The Louisiana Emergency Medical Services Certification Commission is
7	hereby created within the Louisiana Department of Health.
8	B.(1) The commission shall be composed of eleven twelve voting members
9	appointed by the governor as follows:

12	paramedic to be nominated by the Louisiana State Nurses Association from a
13	list of two names submitted by the Louisiana Emergency Nurses Association.

16	established with a physician and under the physician's order; or during the
17	transport of a patient under a protocol that has been approved by the local parish
18	medical society or the emergency medical services practitioner's medical director,
19	until voice communication with the physician is established.

21	C. In a case of a life-threatening situation as determined by a licensed
22	emergency medical services practitioner, when voice contact with a physician is
23	delayed or not possible, or when the delay in treatment could endanger the life of the
24	patient, such a person may render services in accordance with one of the following

26	Section 2. R.S. 40:1133.3(B)(2) is hereby repealed.
27	Section 3. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not
28	signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature
29	by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If

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- 1 vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become
- 2 effective on the day following such approval.

Present law provides for definitions regarding emergency medical services.

Proposed law makes changes to definitions and terminology.

Present law creates the emergency medical services certification commission.

Proposed law renames the commission.

<u>Present law</u> provides for entitlement of the bureau of emergency services in the Louisiana Department of Health to emergency medical personnel criminal history records.

Proposed law adds that the commission is also entitled to the records.

Proposed law removes and renames certain testing fees.

Proposed law increases the number of voting commission members from 11 to 12.

Present law provides for duties of emergency medical personnel.

Proposed law removes certain requirements provided in the duties.

Effective upon signature of the governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
