Abstract: Provides for toll exemptions for residents of a parish in which a public-private partnership project is located.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides residents of a parish with a population less than 25,000, according to the latest federal decennial census, in which a public-private partnership for a bridge replacement is entirely located within the parish to have free and unhampered passage crossing the public-private partnership project bridge.

<u>Proposed law</u> exempts permanent residents of a parish with a population less than 25,000, according to the latest federal decennial census, in which a public-private partnership for a bridge replacement is entirely located within the parish from the payment of tolls when crossing the public-private partnership project bridge when the resident purchases an exempt toll tag, presents a certificate of motor vehicle registration, and provides proof of residency.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the Dept. of Transportation and Development to adopt rules and regulations for the efficient implementation and enforcement of the provisions of this proposed law.
