7	services; to provide for definitions; to provide for the renaming of the EMS
8	certification commission; to provide for the commission's entitlement to emergency
9	medical personnel criminal history records; to provide for the removal and renaming
10	of certain testing fees; to provide for the number of voting commission members; to
11	provide for duties of emergency medical personnel; and to provide for related
12	matters.
13	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
14	Section 1. R.S. 40:1131(10) and (12) through (26), 1133.1(E)(1), 1133.2(B)(1) and
15	(3), 1133.3(A) and the introductory paragraph of 1133.3(B)(1), 1133.4(A)(1), (2), and (4),
16	1133.5(3), 1133.13(E), 1133.14(A)(2) and the introductory paragraph of (C),
17	1135.3(C)(1)(d) and (3)(b), 1135.8 (C)(4)(c) are hereby amended and reenacted and R.S.

16	intended for the purpose of transporting a victim from the scene to a medical facility
17	regardless of its designation. Included are such vehicles referred to but not limited
18	to the designation as "sprint car", "quick response vehicle", "special response
19	vehicle", "triage trucks", "staff cars", "supervisor units", and other similar
20	designations. Emergency medical response vehicles shall not include fire apparatus
21	and law enforcement patrol vehicles which carry first aid or emergency medical
22	supplies and which respond to medical emergencies as part of their routine duties.
23	(13)(14) "Emergency medical services" or "EMS" means a system that
24	represents the combined efforts of several professionals and agencies to provide
25	prehospital out-of-hospital emergency, urgent, preventive, and non-emergent care
26	to the sick and injured.
27	(14)(15) "EMS medical director" means a physician licensed by the
28	Louisiana State Board of Medical Examiners who is board certified or board
29	eligible in emergency medicine or who has a minimum of five years experience

- 1 working in a hospital emergency department who has responsibility and authority 2 to ensure quality of care and provide guidance for all medical aspects of EMS. 3 (15)(16) "EMS practitioner" means an individual who is a licensed emergency medical responder, licensed emergency medical technician, licensed 4 advanced emergency medical technician, or a licensed paramedic. 5 (16)(17) "EMS task force" means the Emergency Medical Services Task 6 Force, composed of individuals subject to the approval of the secretary of the 7 8 department, which advises and makes recommendations to the bureau of emergency 9 medical services and the department on matters related to emergency medical 10 services. 11 (17)(18) "Industrial ambulance" means any vehicle owned and operated by 12 an industrial facility and used for transporting any employee who becomes sick, 13 injured, or otherwise incapacitated in the course and scope of his employment from a job site to an appropriate medical facility. 14
- 15(18)(19)16has successfully completed an emergency medical responder education program17based on National EMS Education Standards approved by the bureau and who is18licensed by the bureau.
- 19(19)(20)"Licensed emergency medical services practitioner" means an20individual who is a licensed emergency medical responder or who is nationally21registered, who has successfully completed an emergency medical services22practitioner education program based on national EMS education standards, and who23is licensed as any one of the following:
  - (a) A licensed emergency medical technician.
  - (b) A licensed advanced emergency medical technician.
  - (c) A licensed paramedic.

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27 (20)(21) "Moral turpitude" means an act of baseness, vileness, or depravity
28 in the duties which one person owes another, or to society in general, which is
29 contrary to the usual, accepted, and customary rule of right and duty which a person

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1 should follow.

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# (21)(22) "Municipal nonprofit organization" means an organization owned by a parish, municipality, or entity of a parish or municipality which in its regular course of business responds to a call for help and renders medical treatment and whose attendants are emergency medical personnel, a registered nurse, or a physician.

7 (22)(23) "National EMS education standards" means the document that
8 outlines current nationally recognized EMS education standards, has been adopted
9 by the bureau, and defines terminal objectives for each nationally defined EMS
10 licensing level.

11 (23)(24) "Physician" means a physician licensed to practice medicine by the
 Louisiana State Board of Medical Examiners.

13 (24)(25) "Public safety agency" means a functional division of a public or
 14 private agency which provides firefighting, police, medical, or other emergency
 15 services.

16 (25)(26) "Public safety telecommunicator" means an individual answering
 17 911 emergency medical condition calls on behalf of a public safety agency who has
 18 authority, based on a protocol adopted by the agency, to provide telephone
 19 cardiopulmonary resuscitation (T-CPR) instructions to a caller before arrival of
 20 professional medical assistance by first responders.

21 (26)(27) "Volunteer nonprofit organization" means an organization which in
22 its regular course of business responds to a call for help and renders medical
23 treatment and whose attendants are emergency medical personnel, a registered nurse,
24 or a physician and which is chartered as a nonprofit organization under Section 501c
25 of the United States Internal Revenue Code, as a volunteer fire department by the
26 Louisiana state fire marshal's office, or as a nonprofit organization by the Louisiana
27 secretary of state.

2	E.(1) The commission and bureau shall be entitled to the criminal history

4	signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature
5	by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If
6	vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become
7	effective on the day following such approval.
