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Provides relative to domestic violence. (8/1/24)

<u>Present law</u> defines "forensic medical examination" as an examination provided to the victim of a sexually oriented criminal offense for the purpose of gathering and preserving evidence for use in court. <u>Proposed law</u> adds victims of domestic abuse to the definition of forensic medical examination. <u>Present law</u> provides for procedures for victims of a sexually oriented criminal offense, immunity, regional plans, maximum allowable costs, definitions, and documents requested by the victim. <u>Proposed law</u> applies the same procedure available to victims of a sexually oriented criminal offense in <u>present law</u> to victims of a sexually oriented criminal offense. <u>Proposed law</u> defines "domestic abuse" as deferred adjudication, adjudication withheld, or conviction for the perpetration or attempted perpetration of certain crimes. <u>Present law</u> attaches rights provided to victims of sexual assault whether the victim seeks the assistance of either a law enforcement official or a healthcare provider. <u>Proposed law</u> attaches the same right provided to victims of sexual assault contained in <u>present law</u> to victims of domestic abuse.

EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION

<u>Proposed law</u> will have an indeterminable, but significant, impact on state expenditures in the Department of Public Safety (DPS), Office of State Police to process sexual assault kits of domestic abuse victims. The proposed law does not identify a recurring source of funding to support the expenditures.

According to DPS, approximately 5,000 reports of domestic violence occur annually in Louisiana. DPS estimates approximately 300 cases will be reported to the crime lab for analysis each year. To accommodate the increase of sexual assault kits (SAKs) to be processed, the Louisiana State Police Crime Lab reports the staffing requirements will incorporate four (4) new T.O. positions. The LFO is unable to predict the exact number of domestic abuse victims who will opt for tests and treatments exclusive to victims of domestic abuse.

However, for illustrative purposes, the table below provides the potential expenditure impact of four (4) Crime Lab Analyst positions that are required to process the estimated 300 kits which is the anticipated number to be assigned to the crime lab annually as a result of this measure. 300 kits represents 6% of the 5,000 reports of domestic violence cases in Louisiana each year.
