1 Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not 2 signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature 3 by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If 4 vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become 5 effective on the day following such approval.

<u>Present law</u> creates numerous tourist commissions around the state as political subdivisions. Authorizes each commission to levy and collect a hotel occupancy tax to be used for the operation of the commission and for attracting conventions and tourists.

<u>Present law</u> provides the Shreveport-Bossier Convention and Tourist Bureau with a maximum rate of four and one-half percent until 25 years after June 30, 1999.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> but extends the sunset of the maximum rate of four and one-half percent for an additional 25 years, <u>from</u> June 30, 1999 to June 30, 2049.

Effective upon signature of the governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
