LAW ENFORCEMENT. Requires in-person trauma-informed training for law enforcement officers. (8/1/24)

1	AN ACT
2	To enact R.S. 40:2405.8(J), relative to peace office training requirements; to require trauma-
3	informed training; to provide for terms and conditions; and to provide for related
4	matters.
5	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
6	Section 1. R.S. 40:2405.8(J) is hereby enacted to read as follows:
7	§2405.8. Additional peace officer training requirements
8	* * *
9	J.(1) The council shall develop and continuously update trauma-
10	informed training materials in its basic and in-service training curriculums.
11	(2) The trauma-informed materials shall consist of trauma-informed
12	skills, practices, and leadership.
13	(3) The initial orientation to trauma-informed training shall be
14	classroom instruction, and shall be conducted at a P.O.S.T. accredited academy
15	or a P.O.S.T. approved training center. The council may designate an
16	alternative method for delivery of the training when otherwise not logistically
17	feasible.

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(4) All peace officers employed on August 1, 2024, who have been employed for one year or more, shall complete the training within one year after the curriculum has been developed and approved by the council.

SB 439 Original

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<u>Proposed law</u> requires the Council on Peace Officer Standards and Training (P.O.S.T. or council) to develop and continuously update trauma-informed training materials in its basic and in-service training curriculums.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the trauma informed materials to consist of trauma-informed skills, practices, and leadership.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the initial orientation to trauma-informed training be classroom instruction, and be conducted at a P.O.S.T. accredited academy or a P.O.S.T. approved training center. <u>Proposed law</u> authorizes the council to designate an alternative method for delivery of the training when otherwise not logistically feasible.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires all peace officers employed on August 1, 2024, who have been employed for one year or more, to complete the training within one year after the curriculum has been developed and approved by the council.

Effective August 1, 2024.
