<u>Present law</u> (R.S. 17:3074.1(C)) provides that by January 1, 2022, and at least once every three years thereafter, the advisory council must review the workforce priorities of the state and each of its workforce regions and designate qualified programs.

<u>Proposed law</u> deletes <u>present law</u> and provides that the Louisiana Workforce Commission convene the advisory council annually for program updates. Further provides that at least once every three years, the advisory council must review the workforce priorities of the state and each of its workforce regions and designate qualified programs.

<u>Present law</u> (R.S. 17:3074.4(C)) provides that state appropriations for the program cannot exceed \$10,500,000 per year for students enrolled in public postsecondary education institutions or proprietary schools.

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Coding: Words which are struck through are deletions from existing law; words in **boldface type and underscored** are additions.

<u>Proposed law</u> changes the amount the program cannot exceed $\underline{\text{from}}$ \$10,500,000 $\underline{\text{to}}$ \$40,000,000.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires that La. Office of Student Financial Assistance is to define the period of the year to which a student must attend an educational program in order to qualify under the provisions of <u>present law</u>".

Effective upon signature of the governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.

Committee Amendments Proposed by Senate Committee on Education to the original bill

- 1. Removes the limit on the allocation to proprietary schools.
