Mizell

<u>Present law</u> requires that the minimum school day for grades one through 12 in every public school in the state consist of 360 minutes of instructional time, exclusive of all recesses. <u>Present law</u> further requires that the minimum school year consist of 177 days of instruction.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and adds the requirement that the minimum school week for grades one through 12 in every public school in the state consist of five consecutive days within a week, except for acknowledged legal holidays.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides exceptions to the five-day school day requirement in <u>proposed law</u> in either one of the following circumstances:

- (1) Any school district that receives a performance score of A or B from the state Dept. of Education.
- (2) Any city, parish, or other local school system that provides for a four day school week on the effective date of this Act.

Effective upon signature of the governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
