**Abstract:** Decreases the age requirement for barber college students.

Present law provides that barber colleges shall not admit students under 17 years of age.

<u>Proposed law</u> changes the age limit for barber college admission <u>from 17 to 16</u> years of age unless the student is enrolled in a board-approved barber college that operates within a state high school.

<u>Present law</u> provides that a person who is at least 18 years old, upon payment of a fee provided and his application, shall be examined by the board to determine his qualifications to receive a certificate of registration to practice barbering in this state.

<u>Proposed law</u> changes the age requirement for certification <u>from</u> 18 years old <u>to</u> 17 years old.

## Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

The Committee Amendments Proposed by House Committee on Commerce to the original bill:

- 1. Add that high school students may enroll in a board-approved barber college that operates within a state high school.
- 2. Change the age requirement of a student to receive a certificate of registration to practice barbering <u>from</u> 18 years of age <u>to</u> 17 years of age.
- 3. Make technical changes.
