HORTICULTURE: Provides with respect to retail florists and wholesale florists

1 AN ACT

2 To amend and reenact R.S. 3:3801(A)(introductory paragraph) and (5) and (C)(2), 3805, and
3 3808(J) through (P), to enact R.S. 3:3804(B)(3) and 3808(Q), and to repeal R.S.
4 3:3801(A)(6) and (C)(3), 3804(A)(2) and (3), 3806(I), 3807(B)(2) and (3), and
5 3808(B), (C), and (I), relative to retail and wholesale florists; to remove the
6 regulation, examination, and licensing of retail and wholesale florists; to provide for
7 the membership of the Horticulture Commission of Louisiana; to establish the
8 occupation of and the requirements for floral dealers; to provide for rules and
9 regulations of the Department of Agriculture and Forestry; to provide for an effective
10 date; and to provide for related matters.

11 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

12 Section 1. R.S. 3:3801(A)(introductory paragraph) and (5) and (C)(2), 3805, and
13 3808(J) through (P) are hereby amended and reenacted and R.S. 3:3804(B)(3) and 3808 (Q)
14 are hereby enacted to read as follows:

15 §3801. Horticulture Commission

16 A. The Horticulture Commission of Louisiana is hereby created within the
17 Department of Agriculture and Forestry to be comprised of the following ~~thirteen~~
18 members:

20 (5) A ~~licensed retail florist.~~ floral dealer.

1 C. The following members shall be appointed by the commissioner, subject
2 to confirmation of the Senate, and shall serve terms of four calendar years beginning
3 with the year of appointment in accordance with the following provisions:

5 (2) The ~~licensed retail florist~~ floral dealer shall be appointed during the
6 second year of each administration from a list of three persons nominated by the
7 Louisiana State Florists Association, Inc.

9 §3804. Regulation of professions and occupations

10 * * *

11 B. The commission shall regulate the following occupations:

13 (3) Floral dealer.

15 §3805. Applications

16 Each application to take an examination and each application for a license or
17 permit shall be in writing and shall be on forms which shall be prescribed by the
18 commission. Each application shall be accompanied by the appropriate fee and by
19 such documents as the commission may require. Each applicant shall indicate on the
20 application the street address of his residence and the street address of his place of
21 business. If the residence or place of business does not have a street address, the
22 applicant shall provide sufficient information to establish the physical location of the
23 residence or place of business. Each applicant for a nursery stock ~~dealer's permit~~
24 dealer, or a cut flower ~~dealer's permit~~ dealer, or floral dealer permit shall have an
25 identifying sales tax number issued by the secretary of revenue and taxation and shall
26 indicate that number on the application.

28 §3808. Terms and conditions of licenses and permits

29 * * *

1 J. A floral dealer's permit authorizes the holder to sell cut flowers and
2 ornamental plants in pots. Each person engaged in the occupation of a floral dealer
3 may operate a vending machine at a location remote from the individual's place of
4 business for the sale of cut flowers, subject to all of the following requirements:

5 (1) The permittee shall obtain a floral dealer's permit for each vending
6 machine.

7 (2) The cut flowers sold from the vending machine shall be inspected at the
8 owner's place of business prior to placement in the vending machine.

9 (3) The vending machine shall be monitored in person or electronically by
10 an employee of the business at least once each business day and serviced as needed.

11 (4) The permittee shall not operate vending machines outside the parish more
12 than twenty-five miles beyond his place of business.

13 ~~J.~~ K. Each person issued a permit ~~under~~ pursuant to the provisions of this
14 Chapter shall meet the occupational standards determined by the commission for
15 each occupation and shall notify the commission of each change in the address of the
16 permit holder.

17 ~~K.~~ L. Each person who holds a valid Louisiana Nursery Certificate Permit
18 may use that permit in lieu of a nursery stock dealer's permit, or a cut flower dealer's
19 permit, or both, at any one outlet.

20 ~~L.~~ M. Each nursery stock dealer and cut flower dealer shall secure an
21 appropriate permit for each outlet operated by the dealer.

22 ~~M.~~ N. Each license and permit issued ~~under~~ pursuant to the provisions of this
23 Chapter shall expire on January thirty-first of each year and may be renewed in
24 accordance with rules adopted by the commission.

25 ~~N.~~ O. Each holder of a license or permit issued ~~under~~ pursuant to the
26 provisions of this Chapter shall present such license or permit upon demand of any
27 authorized agent of the horticulture commission.

28 ~~O.~~ P. Utility arborists shall be subject to the following provisions:

1 (1) A utility arborist's license authorizes the holder thereof to recommend or
2 execute the removal of trees or portions of trees along utility rights of way.

3 (2) For license renewal, each utility arborist is required to attend a continuing
4 training seminar as determined by rule by the commission.

5 ~~P.~~ Q. Landscape irrigation contractors shall be subject to the following
6 provisions:

7 (1) Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, a landscape irrigation
8 contractor's license authorizes the holder to construct, install, connect, repair,
9 maintain, improve, or alter any portion of a landscape irrigation system, including
10 the required wiring within that system, and to install and connect the landscape
11 irrigation system to the required power supply and to a public or private water supply
12 system.

13 (2) For license renewal, each landscape irrigation contractor shall obtain
14 continuing training as determined by rule of the commission.

15 (3) He shall request and be issued any necessary permits from any governing
16 authority.

17 (4) Prior to connecting to a public or private water supply system, a licensed
18 landscape irrigation contractor shall obtain a water supply protection specialist
19 endorsement from the State Plumbing Board. The State Plumbing Board shall issue
20 a special endorsement of a water supply protection specialist to any licensed
21 landscape irrigation contractor who completes the training required by the State
22 Plumbing Board as provided for in R.S. 37:1368(H)(1); however, neither a
23 journeyman plumber's license nor a master plumber's license shall be required.

24 (5) Backflow prevention devices shall be installed in accordance with the
25 provisions of Part XIV of the Louisiana State Sanitary Code by a person holding a
26 water supply protection specialist endorsement.

27 (6) Nothing in this Subsection shall permit any licensed landscape irrigation
28 contractor to perform any electrical or plumbing services not provided for in this
29 Subsection, for which a license is required from any other regulatory board. Nothing

1 in this Subsection shall prohibit a licensed electrician or plumber from providing
2 electrical or plumbing services necessary to make or keep an irrigation system
3 operational.

4 Section 2. R.S. 3:3801(A)(6) and (C)(3), 3804(A)(2) and (3), 3806(I), 3807(B)(2)
5 and (3), and 3808(B), (C), and (I) are hereby repealed in their entirety.

6 Section 3. Any rule or regulation promulgated by the Department of Agriculture and
7 Forestry providing for the regulation, examination, and licensing of retail florists and
8 wholesale florists shall be null, void, and without effect upon the effective date of this Act.
9 The Department of Agriculture and Forestry shall issue a notice of intent to amend its rules
10 and regulations in conformity with this Act on or before September 1, 2024 and adopt the
11 amended rules and regulations on or before December 1, 2024.

12 Section 4. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not
13 signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature
14 by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If
15 vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become
16 effective on the day following such approval.

Abstract: Repeals the examination and licensing requirements for retail and wholesale florists and creates a floral dealer permit.

Present law authorizes a retail florist to arrange or supervise the arrangement of floral designs which include living or freshly cut plant materials and to sell at retail floral designs, cut flowers, and ornamental plants in pots normally and customarily sold by florists.

Proposed law repeals present law.

Present law authorizes a wholesale florist to prepare and sell cut flowers, plant materials, and ornamental plants in pots normally and customarily used by retail florists to persons who hold a retail florist's license and to prepare and sell cut flowers to persons who hold a cut flower dealer's permit. However, prohibits a wholesale florist from arranging or selling floral designs.

Proposed law repeals present law.

Present law provides that the membership of the Horticulture Commission includes a retail florist and a wholesale florist.

Proposed law repeals present law and provides that the membership includes a floral dealer.

Present law provides for the regulation, examination, and licensing of retail and wholesale florists.

Proposed law repeals present law and creates a floral dealer permit.

Present law provides for certain authorizations a person who holds a cut flower dealer's permit has.

Proposed law repeals present law.

Proposed law authorizes a floral dealer to sell cut flowers and ornamental plants in pots and modifies provisions regulating the operation of vending machines by restricting permittees to their respective parishes, no more than 25 miles beyond their place of business.

Proposed law declares that any rule or regulation providing for the regulation, examination, and licensing of retail and wholesale florists are null, void, and without effect upon the effective date of proposed law.

Proposed law requires the department to issue a notice of intent to amend its rules and regulations in conformity with proposed law on or before Sept. 1, 2024 and adopt same on or before Dec. 1, 2024.

Effective upon signature of governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.

Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

1. Make technical changes.
2. Remove a floral dealer permit fee.
3. Repeal present and proposed law relative to a what a cut flower dealer's permit authorizes the holder to do.
4. Repeal proposed law regarding how many vending machines a permittee can operate.
