EMERGENCY POWERS. Provides relative to termination of a public health emergency. (gov sig)

AN ACT

2	To amend and reenact R.S. 29:724(B)(2) and 768(B), relative to emergency declarations; to
3	authorize the legislature to terminate all or part of an emergency declaration; to
4	provide for the procedure by which the petition is signed and transmitted to the
5	governor; to provide for the effectiveness of the petition to terminate; to provide for
6	an effective date; to provide for retroactive application; and to provide for related
7	matters.
8	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature 5 by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If 6 7 vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become 8 effective on the day following such approval. 9 Section 3. The provisions of this Act shall be given prospective and retroactive 10 application.

<u>Present law</u> provides for the termination of a public health emergency when the governor determines that the threat of danger has passed or the disaster or emergency has been dealt with to the extent that the emergency conditions no longer exist.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u>.

<u>Present law</u> authorizes the legislature, in consultation with the public health authority, to terminate a public health emergency by a petition signed by a majority of the surviving members of either house, and requires the governor to issue an executive order or proclamation ending the public health emergency.

<u>Proposed law</u> deletes the requirement that the legislature consult with the public health authority, and otherwise retains <u>present law</u>.

Effective upon signature of the governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
