## A RESOLUTION

To commend Lance Corporal Christopher Spicer Jr. for being awarded the Louisiana Sheriffs' Association's Deputy Valor Award.

WHEREAS, the Deputy Valor award seeks to recognize a deputy who provides service that is unquestionably, above and beyond the call of duty, and who performs any extreme life-threatening act of bravery; and

WHEREAS, on August 26, 2023, at approximately 11:15 p.m., Lance Corporal Spicer Jr. a deputy with the Cameron Parish Sheriff's Office initiated a traffic stop for a traffic violation where the driver refused to identify himself; and

WHEREAS, after continued efforts by deputy Spicer to identify the driver, the suspect became very agitated; and

WHEREAS, when deputy Spicer ordered the driver out of the vehicle, the driver did not comply and fled the scene; and

WHEREAS, deputy Spicer immediately initiated pursuit on Louisiana Highway 27; and

WHEREAS, the suspect then stopped and began firing several rounds from a weapon striking deputy Spicer's unit ten times; and

WHEREAS, one of the bullets lodged in the driver's headrest approximately two inches from the top of deputy Spicer's head; and

WHEREAS, the suspect continued speeding northbound on Louisiana Highway 27; and

WHEREAS, even after the gunfire, and with no immediate backup, deputy Spicer continued pursuit of the suspect into Calcasieu Parish; and

WHEREAS, deputy Spicer followed the suspect down Burton Shipyard Road where the suspect turned into a plant entrance and entered through the guard gate; and

WHEREAS, knowing that the suspect had entered a dead-end road, deputy Spicer set up a roadblock just outside the gate and waited until the suspect exited the facility; and

WHEREAS, the suspect then exited the plant and began traveling toward deputy Spicer's location at a high-speed while also firing upon deputy Spicer, and Deputy Spicer returned fire; and

WHEREAS, the vehicle headed west on Burton Shipyard Road, then turned north on Louisiana Highway 27, fleeing on many other parish roads; and

WHEREAS, several other law enforcement agencies joined and assisted in this pursuit including, Calcasieu Parish Sheriff's Office, Louisiana State Police, Sulphur Police Department, and Vinton Police Department; and

WHEREAS, the fleeing suspect was unable to negotiate a left-handed curve, and his vehicle traveled off the roadway through multiple ditches and crashed; and

WHEREAS, the suspect exited the vehicle, took a covered position in the ditch and began firing a fully automatic weapon at responding officers; and

WHEREAS, at least five law enforcement officers exchanged gunfire with the suspect; and

WHEREAS, the suspect then moved into a nearby open field and continued to fire at the responding officers; and

WHEREAS, the exchange lasted twenty-three minutes and one officer from the Sulphur Police Department sustained a non-life threatening gunshot wound to the head; and

WHEREAS, the suspect retreated into a field, where air assets located him deceased wearing body armor and with a fully automatic weapon; and

WHEREAS, the suspect died as a result of a self-inflicted gunshot wound to the head; and

WHEREAS, Lance Corporal Chris Spicer Jr. demonstrated quick thinking and immense courage when faced with a life-threatening situation and his actions deem him worthy of the Louisiana Sheriffs' Association's highest honor, the Deputy Valor Award; and

WHEREAS, the Louisiana Sheriff's Association is proud to honor him.
