5	devoted wife, mother, educator, dance instructor, and community leader who touched
6	many lives through her faith, dedication, and service.
7	WHEREAS, Jean Arnette Benjamin was born on December 22, 1951, in New
8	Orleans, Louisiana; Jean's strong faith in God began with her baptism and confirmation at
9	Corpus Christi Catholic Church at an early age; and
10	WHEREAS, she received a Catholic education from Corpus Christi Elementary
11	School, Xavier University Preparatory, and Xavier University of Louisiana, where she
12	earned a Bachelor of Education in Health and Physical Education; and
13	WHEREAS, during her senior year of college, Jean pledged Alpha Kappa Alpha with
14	the Epsilon Tau Chapter at Xavier University; and
15	WHEREAS, she was honored with a fellowship to the University of Northern Iowa,
16	where she obtained her master's degree in Health, Physical Education, and Dance; and
17	WHEREAS, Jean began her teaching career with the Orleans Parish School System
18	at Alfred G. Priestley Junior High and concluded her twenty-year career at Francis W.

1	Gregory Junior High School, where she also coached track and field and sponsored the
2	majorettes; and
3	WHEREAS, in 1976, Jean, her sister Velda, and their late mother, Dr. Velma
4	Benjamin, founded The Benjamin's School of Dance & Gymnastics and The Benjamin's
5	Adult Fitness Center, providing instruction in ballet, tap, jazz, baton twirling, and
6	gymnastics; and
7	WHEREAS, The Benjamin's School of Dance & Gymnastics hosted twenty-nine
8	annual dance recitals, presenting record crowds and Broadway-style extravaganzas complete
9	with the pageantry of a queen and her court, priding themselves on preparing students for
10	the stage and life experiences related to the arts; and
11	WHEREAS, Jean married her elementary school sweetheart, retired Lieutenant
12	(NOPD) Russell Mark Vappie, and this union was blessed with a daughter, Beverly Alice;
13	and
14	WHEREAS, Jean often expressed that her greatest gift from God was their daughter,
15	Beverly, and she and Russell supported every aspect of Beverly's life with love and devotion,
16	celebrating her graduation from Spelman College in 2016, with great joy and pride; and
17	WHEREAS, Jean was diagnosed with breast cancer twice and emerged victorious
18	on both occasions; and
19	WHEREAS, in 2017, she and Elizabeth Bridges co-founded the Benjamin & Yancy
20	Foundation, Incorporated in loving memory of Jean's mother, Dr. Velma Colbert Benjamin,
21	and Elizabeth's sister, Jacqueline (Jackie) Bridges Yancy who lost their battles with cancer;
22	the foundation promotes early cancer detection and offers screenings, therapy, and
23	educational support to individuals dealing with breast and prostate cancer; and
24	WHEREAS, Jean loved decorating her home during all holidays, especially Mardi
25	Gras, attending parades with her father and marveling at the colorful costumes and detailed
26	beadwork of New Orleans' own Mardi Gras Indians; and
27	WHEREAS, Jean enjoyed hosting family Thanksgiving dinners as a yearly tradition
28	and was a proud aunt to Cori, Keyana, and Trey; Jean's devotion to the Blessed Mother was
29	evident in her weekly rosary prayers and her hosting of the May crowning for several years;
