REAL ESTATE/COMMISSION: Provides relative to the Louisiana Real Estate Commission

1 AN ACT

2 To amend and reenact R.S. 37:1432(B), relative to the Louisiana Real Estate Commission;
3 to provide for the terms of appointment of commissioners; to provide for an effective
4 date; and to provide for related matters.

5 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

6 Section 1. R.S. 37:1432(B) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

7 §1432. Louisiana Real Estate Commission; qualifications; terms of office

8 * * *

9 B. Each appointment to the commission shall be for a six-year term. No
10 commissioner shall serve more than ~~one~~ two six-year ~~term~~ terms.

11 * * *

12 Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not
13 signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature
14 by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If
15 vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become
16 effective on the day following such approval.

Abstract: Provides for the terms of appointment for commissioners of the La. Real Estate Commission.

Present law provides for the La. Real Estate Commission (commission). The commission is required to have 11 members from various regions of the state who are appointed by the governor. Each appointment is subject to Senate confirmation.

Present law provides for the terms of appointment for commissioners. Present law provides that each term is a six-year term. Further, present law provides that no commissioner can serve more than one six-year term.

Proposed law changes present law by allowing each commissioner to serve two six-year terms.

Effective upon signature of governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
