Provides for reporting, data collection, and information sharing related to domestic and imported seafood

Proposed law requires seafood processors and distributors to submit quarterly reports to the Louisiana Department of Culture, Recreation, and Tourism (CRT) detailing the amount and species of seafood they bought and sold, including volume and location of origin. Proposed law provides that CRT is to maintain a database of this information and is authorized to penalize entities that do not comply. Additionally, proposed law requires new seafood importers who are applying for licensure to provide the Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries (LDWF) with a detailed accounting of the imported seafood they bought or sold in the previous calendar year. LDWF shall submit a copy or summary of the information collected to CRT.

## **EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION**

There is no anticipated direct material effect on governmental expenditures as a result of this measure. Proposed law requires seafood processors and distributors to submit quarterly reports to the Louisiana Department of Culture, Recreation, and Tourism (CRT) detailing the amount and species of seafood they bought and sold, including volume and location of origin. Proposed law requires CRT to maintain a database of these quarterly reports and shall impose fines for entities not complying. CRT asserts that they will be able to absorb the additional functions with current staff and resources.

Proposed law requires new seafood importers who are applying for licensure to provide the Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries (LDWF) with a detailed accounting of the imported seafood they bought or sold in the previous calendar year. The department anticipates increased expenditures for storage of the data collected, but would not need additional staff. LDWF anticipates implementing the proposed law using its existing operating budget.

## **REVENUE EXPLANATION**

CRT will have an increase in revenue generated from fines collected for non compliance with the proposed law. Under current law, a first offense may result in a fine up to \$1,000; a second offense up to \$2,500; and a third offense up to \$5,000. All fines collected will be deposited into the Imported Safety Seafood Fund. CRT is unable to determine to what extent fines would increase; however, a corresponding increase in revenue is anticipated.
