Abstract:

Provides for teacher certification and professional development with respect to numeracy.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that <u>proposed law</u> shall be known and may be cited as "The Louisiana Numeracy and Excellence (LANE) Act".

Certification

<u>Proposed law</u> requires applicants for teacher certification to meet at least one of these requirements:

- (1) Complete the prescribed number of semester hours in the teaching of foundational numeracy as established in State Bd. of Elementary and Secondary Education (BESE) rule.
- (2) Complete numeracy training appropriate to the certification area and approved by the state Dept. of Education (DOE).

<u>Proposed law</u> further requires an applicant who is applying for initial certification to teach kindergarten through eighth grade to have completed either the prescribed number of semester hours in accordance with <u>proposed law</u> or <u>present law</u> numeracy training.

<u>Proposed law provides for proposed law implementation beginning on Sept. 1, 2028.</u>

Professional Development

<u>Present law</u> requires professional development in numeracy instruction for fourth through eighth grade teachers. <u>Proposed law</u> expands this requirement to apply also to kindergarten through third grade teachers and additionally requires numeracy coaches for, at a minimum, kindergarten through third grade teachers.

<u>Present law</u> and <u>proposed law</u> relative to professional development and numeracy coaches are subject to the allocation of funds by DOE. <u>Present law</u> prohibits state or obligated funds from being used for implementation. <u>Proposed law</u> allows state and federal funds to be used for implementation if numeracy-related expenditures are allowable under relevant funding guidelines.

<u>Present law</u> provides that nothing in <u>present law</u> shall be construed to extend the hours in the teacher's work day nor the hours worked in a year. <u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and applies it to <u>proposed law</u> and additionally authorizes a public school governing authority to offer a stipend for completion of numeracy training outside of a teacher's normal work day or a combination of a stipend and job-embedded training time.
