PHARMACEUTICALS. Provides relative to the dispensing of ivermectin. (gov sig)

1	AN ACT
2	To enact R.S. 37:1218.3, relative to the dispensing of ivermectin; to provide for a standing
3	order for the dispensing of ivermectin; to provide for pharmacist authorization; to
4	provide for rulemaking; to provide for immunity; to provide for an effective date;
5	and to provide for related matters.
6	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
7	Section 1. R.S. 37:1218.3 is hereby enacted to read as follows:
8	§1218.3. Authorization to dispense ivermectin
9	A. A pharmacist may dispense ivermectin to any person who is eighteen
10	years of age or older pursuant to a standing order issued by the Louisiana
11	Department of Health.
12	B.(1) The Louisiana Department of Health shall adopt rules to establish
13	standard procedures for the dispensing of ivermectin including but not limited
14	<u>to:</u>
15	(a) Providing the patient with a screening risk assessment tool.
16	(b) Providing the patient with information on the indications and
17	contraindications for the use of ivermectin, the appropriate method for using

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1	ivermectin, the importance of medical follow-up, and any other information
2	considered appropriate by the department.
3	(2) The rules may include prohibitions on dispensing ivermectin that
4	contains any ingredients determined by the department to be harmful.
5	C. In addition to the ingredient cost and dispensing fee associated with
6	dispensing ivermectin, a pharmacy may charge an administrative fee for the
7	services provided pursuant to Paragraph (B)(1) of this Section.
8	D. A pharmacist acting in good faith and with reasonable care pursuant
9	to the Section is immune from disciplinary or adverse administrative actions
10	from the Louisiana Board of Pharmacy and is immune from civil liability in the
11	absence of gross negligence or willful misconduct.
12	E. Nothing in this Section shall be construed to require a health
13	insurance issuer to provide coverage for the cost of ivermectin dispensed
14	pursuant to the provisions of this Section.
15	Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not
16	signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature
17	by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If
18	vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become
19	effective on the day following such approval.

<u>Proposed law</u> authorizes a pharmacist to dispense ivermectin to a person 18 or older pursuant to a standing order issued by the La. Dept. of Health.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the La. Dept. of Health to adopt rules to establish procedures for dispensing ivermectin.

<u>Proposed law</u> authorizes a pharmacy to charge an administrative fee for any services required by <u>proposed law</u> in addition to the ingredient cost and dispensing fee.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides for immunity for pharmacists dispensing ivermectin in accordance with proposed law.

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<u>Proposed law</u> provides that a health insurance issuer is not required to provide coverage for the cost of ivermectin dispensed pursuant to <u>proposed law</u>.

Effective upon signature of the governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.

Committee Amendments Proposed by Senate Committee on Health and Welfare to the original bill

1. Changes the effective date <u>from</u> August 1, 2025 to upon signature of the governor.
