WHEREAS, Richard Zuschlag received numerous awards throughout his distinguished career, including the J. Walter Schaefer Award from the American Ambulance Association, the James O. Page/JEMS Leadership Award, the Pinnacle EMS Lifetime Achievement Award, and the Ernst & Young Entrepreneur of the Year in Healthcare and Healthcare Services; and

WHEREAS, he was named by Inc. Magazine as Entrepreneur of the Year for his efforts in coordinating Hurricane Katrina rescue efforts and has been inducted into the Louisiana Political Hall of Fame and named a "Louisiana Legend" by Louisiana Public Broadcasting; and

WHEREAS, Richard served as Chairman of the Lafayette Parish Communication District, and was involved in numerous organizations including the Louisiana Emergency Preparedness Association, the Governor's Patient Compensation Fund, One Acadiana, the Baton Rouge Area Chamber, Louisiana Association of Broadcasters, Louisiana Association of Business and Industry, and the Acadiana Safety Association; and

WHEREAS, he dedicated his time and talent to many civic organizations, serving

WHEREAS, he received numerous accolades for his philanthropy and civic engagement, including the Lafayette Civic Cup, the Distinguished Citizen Award from the Boy Scouts, the Golden Mike Award from the Louisiana Association of Broadcasters, and the U.S. Senate Innovation Award on behalf of Acadian Ambulance Service; and

WHEREAS, Richard Zuschlag was an admired agent of change whose vision, generosity, and leadership impacted countless lives in Louisiana and across the nation; and

WHEREAS, he had a way of bringing out the best in everyone around him; he was the ultimate host with an uncanny ability to create the most precious, memorable moments in the course of otherwise regular activities; and

WHEREAS, his legacy endures through his family, in every life saved, every patient helped, and the continued success of Acadian Companies, exemplifying servant leadership, integrity, and determination; and

WHEREAS, Richard Zuschlag is survived by his beloved wife of forty-seven years, Elaine Dupuis Zuschlag to whom he credits all of his successes; his three cherished children: Beth Zuschlag LeBlanc, Blair Zuschlag, and Blaise Zuschlag; his nine adored grandchildren; his golden retriever Sandy; his siblings Charlotte Zuschlag, John Zuschlag, and Tom Zuschlag; and, his extended family and Acadian family.
