Abstract: Adds consumable hemp to the La. Drug Dealer Liability Act.

<u>Present law</u> (R.S. 9:2800.62(2)) defines "illegal controlled substance" as cocaine, phencyclidine, heroin, or methamphetamine, and any other illegal controlled dangerous substance the possession or distribution of which is a violation present law.

<u>Proposed law</u> expands the definition of "illegal controlled substance" to include consumable hemp product as defined in R.S. 3:1481 (any product derived from industrial hemp that contains any cannabinoid, including cannabidiol or THC, and is intended for consumption or topical use) when it is in violation of R.S. 3:1482 (prohibitions) and other provisions of <u>present law</u>.

<u>Present law</u> (R.S. 9:2800.63(A)) provides a list of people who have a cause of action for damages caused by an individual's use of an illegal controlled substance. <u>Present law</u> (R.S. 9:2800.63(B)) also provides the circumstances which give rise to that cause of action.

<u>Proposed law</u> includes an action for damages when a person sells, administers, or furnishes consumable hemp to a person under the age of 21.

Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

- 2. Clarify that there is an action for damages when a person sells, administers, or furnishes consumable hemp to a person under the age of 21.
