HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 130

SPECIAL DAY/WEEK/MONTH: Designates May 12, 2025, as A Day Without Child Care at the state capitol

A RESOLUTION

2	To designate Monday, May 12, 2025, as A Day Without Child Care at the state capitol.
3	WHEREAS, early childhood education is the workforce behind the workforce,
4	supporting the employment of tens of thousands of working Louisiana parents; and
5	WHEREAS, early childhood education, from birth to kindergarten, is significantly
6	underfunded, resulting in many families unable to access necessary care; some early
7	educators leave the field because they cannot earn a livable wage, leaving families,
8	providers, and businesses vulnerable; child care disruptions cost Louisiana's economy \$1.3
9	billion each year; and
10	WHEREAS, For Providers By Providers (4PXP), Louisiana's only provider-led early
11	childhood education organization, is leading the statewide coordination of the National Day
12	Without Child Care to elevate the voices of educators, families, and providers; and
13	WHEREAS, for generations, early childhood educators, parents, families, and
14	caregivers have been fighting for equitable access to affordable child care, better pay, and
15	working conditions for providers; and
16	WHEREAS, fewer than half of child care providers offer staff paid sick days, and
17	fewer than one-third provide health insurance or retirement benefits, highlighting the
18	ongoing challenges in ensuring a stable and supported early childhood workforce; and
19	WHEREAS, among child care providers who lost staff in 2024, nearly half reported
20	that departing employees left for jobs offering higher wages, with lower-paying providers

1 experiencing staff turnover at higher rates than those able to offer more competitive 2 compensation; and 3 WHEREAS, most child care providers report increased staffing costs or challenges, 4 including the need to pay higher wages, hire less experienced staff, and experience turnover 5 as new staff leave within six months of starting; and 6 WHEREAS, early childhood educators are among the lowest-paid professionals in 7 the education sector, earning an average of \$10.63 per hour in Louisiana, despite the critical 8 role they play in supporting children's development and learning during the most formative 9 years; and 10 WHEREAS, many early childhood teachers earn wages so low that they qualify for 11 public assistance programs themselves, highlighting the disconnect between the value of 12 their work and the compensation they receive; and 13 WHEREAS, inadequate pay contributes to high turnover rates among early childhood 14 educators, disrupting the stability and quality of care that young children need to thrive; low 15 wages make it difficult to recruit and retain skilled, passionate professionals in the early 16 childhood education workforce, placing additional strain on child care providers and 17 families; the lack of accessible, high-quality early childhood education hinders Louisiana's 18 capacity to attract and keep young professionals, resulting in a loss of talent, particularly in 19 vital sectors like healthcare and education; and 20 WHEREAS, on Monday, May 12, 2025, child care providers, teachers, families, and 21 community members across Louisiana are joining the National Day Without Child Care to 22 raise awareness about the urgent need for investment in early childhood education and to 23 advocate for a fully funded child care system that powers the economy and supports working 24 families; and 25 WHEREAS, investing in early childhood education is critical to supporting 26 Louisiana's working families, strengthening businesses and growing the state's economy, 27 ensuring every child has a strong start in life, and building a more prosperous future for all 28 communities; early childhood education is as essential to a functioning economy as roads, 29 power, water, and broadband, and must be funded as critical infrastructure.
