SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 92

EDUCATION DEPARTMENT. Directs the state Department of Education to provide specific information in a report to the Senate committees on finance and education relative to the original Charter School Demonstration Programs Law.

1	A RESOLUTION
2	To authorize and direct the state Department of Education to provide specific information
3	in a report to the Senate committees on education and finance relative to the original
4	Charter School Demonstration Programs Law.
5	WHEREAS, the Preamble of Article VIII of the Constitution of Louisiana states "the
6	goal of the public educational system is to provide learning environments and experiences,
7	at all stages of human development, that are humane, just, and designed to promote
8	excellence in order that every individual may be afforded an equal opportunity to develop
9	to his full potential"; and
10	WHEREAS, in an effort to provide learning environments and experiences that are
11	humane, just and designed to promote excellence in order that every individual may be
12	afforded an equal opportunity to develop to his full potential, the legislature enacted Act 192
13	of the 1995 Regular Session; and
14	WHEREAS, the original Act was known and cited as the "Charter School
15	Demonstration Programs Law", as a pilot program to allow a small number of school
16	systems to volunteer to participate in an effort that every individual may be afforded an
17	equal opportunity to develop to his full potential; and
18	WHEREAS, the initial law established the pilot program in eight school districts

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which was expanded in 1997 to all school districts in Louisiana, and in 2003 its scope was
 further broadened by constitutional amendment to authorize the state to take over and
 convert schools into charter schools; and

WHEREAS, a Section of the Act consisted of R.S. 17:3972, which stated in part that
it was the intention of the legislature, in enacting the Charter School Demonstration
Programs Law, to authorize experimentation by city and parish school boards by allowing
the creation of innovative kinds of independent public schools for students; and

8 WHEREAS, it was also the intention of the legislature to provide a framework for 9 such experimentation by the creation of such schools, a means for all persons with valid 10 ideas and motivation to participate in the experiment, and a mechanism by which experiment 11 results can be analyzed, the positive results repeated or replicated, if appropriate, and the 12 negative results identified and eliminated; and

WHEREAS, finally, it was the intention of the legislature that the best interest of
 students who are economically disadvantaged must be the overriding consideration in
 implementing the provisions of the Charter School Demonstration Programs Law; and

WHEREAS, the Act also stated the legislative purpose of the Charter School Demonstration Programs Law was to provide opportunities for educators and others to form, operate, or be employed within a charter school with each school designed to accomplish one or more of a number of objectives; and

20 WHEREAS, the objectives outlined in the original Act, which are still stated in current law, are to improve pupil learning and the public school system; increase learning 21 opportunities and access to quality education for pupils; encourage the use of different and 22 23 innovative teaching methods, educational models, and a variety of governance, management, 24 and administrative structures; require appropriate assessment and measurement of academic learning results; account better and more thoroughly for educational results; and create new 25 professional opportunities for teachers and other school employees, including the 26 27 opportunity to be responsible for the learning program at the school site; and

WHEREAS, a great number of changes have occurred within Louisiana's educational
 system since the inception of the program, including the expansion of charter schools within
 certain municipalities; and

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1 WHEREAS, today many questions surround various aspects of the Charter School 2 Demonstration Programs Law, now known as the Louisiana Public Charter School Law, 3 including its original legislative intent of experimentation, evidence based approaches and 4 its findings; its impact on traditional public schools, and the costs and benefits of the 5 program; and

WHEREAS, since the inception of the program, information regarding the success 6 7 of the experimentation aspects of the evidence based approaches and findings and the annual 8 costs of the program have never been voluntarily provided to the Senate nor the legislature 9 as a body; and

10 WHEREAS, the Senate of the Legislature of Louisiana seeks to review and analyze 11 the experimentation aspects of the evidence based approaches used in accordance with the 12 original Charter School Demonstration Programs Law to determine whether the students 13 who attend charter schools have received, is receiving, and will receive a proper and just 14 education in accordance with the Constitution of Louisiana.

15 THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Senate of the Legislature of Louisiana 16 does hereby authorize and direct the state Department of Education to provide specific information relative to the original Charter School Demonstration Programs Law that at a 17 18 minimum includes a review of the program's purpose and history, and an evaluation of the 19 success of the evidence based approaches, by written report to the Senate committees on 20 education and finance no later than December 31, 2025.

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the report shall address all of the following:

- 22 (1) What are the evidence based approaches used by schools participating in the Charter School Demonstration Program since its inception? 23
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(2) What mechanism was used by the Charter School Demonstration Program schools to determine how the experiment results can be analyzed? 25

(3) What are the positive results of evidence based approaches that have been 26 27 repeated or replicated by participating schools of the Charter School Demonstration 28 Program?

29 (4) What are the negative results of evidence based approaches that have been 30 identified and eliminated by participating schools of the Charter School Demonstration

1	Program?
2	(5) How many charter schools have participated and operated in the program since
3	2003?
4	(6) How many charter schools have closed since the inception of the program?
5	(7) What is the total amount of state tax dollars that has been spent on charter schools
6	between 2005 and 2025?
7	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of the report shall also be submitted to
8	the Louisiana Legislative Auditor's office for review and an assessment of the resources used
9	by the department in its experimentation of evidence base approaches as required by the
10	Charter School Demonstration Programs Law; and that the legislative auditor shall submit
11	its finding to the Senate committees on education and finance by April 1, 2026.
12	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be transmitted to the
13	state superintendent of education and the Louisiana Legislative Auditor.
