2	To designate May 22, 2025, as Celiac Disease Awareness Day at the Louisiana State
3	Capitol.
4	WHEREAS, celiac disease is one of the world's most prevalent genetic autoimmune
5	diseases, affecting an estimated three million Americans, seventy to eighty percent of whom
6	are undiagnosed; and
7	WHEREAS, celiac disease causes the body to attack its own small intestine, which
8	can lead to many other devastating health conditions, including cancer; and
9	WHEREAS, celiac disease results in extraordinary economic and productivity costs
10	to both the public and private sectors from employee and student absenteeism, as well as
11	repeated, inconclusive visits to healthcare providers; and
12	WHEREAS, on average, it takes four years to be correctly diagnosed with celiac
13	disease; and
14	WHEREAS, there is no medication or cure for celiac disease and the only treatment
15	is a lifelong, strict gluten-free diet; and
16	WHEREAS, studies show that up to fifty percent of people on a gluten-free diet
17	continue to experience symptoms and have intestinal damage, revealing the ineffectiveness
18	of the gluten-free diet as a treatment; and

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WHEREAS, the Celiac Disease Foundation is a national, nonprofit organization
dedicated to improving the quality of life and health of individuals with celiac disease by
advancing government support for biomedical research to develop diagnostic tools,
life-improving treatments, and a cure for celiac disease, and to raise public awareness of this
serious disease.
THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Senate of the Legislature of Louisiana
does hereby commend the work of the Celiac Disease Foundation and designates May 22,
2025, as Celiac Disease Awareness Day at the Louisiana State Capitol.
BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be transmitted to chief
executive officer of the Celiac Disease Foundation.
