JUDGES/JUSTICE OF PEACE: Provides for the territorial jurisdiction and election districts of the justice of the peace courts and constables in Iberville Parish

AN ACT

2	To enact R.S. 13:2623, relative to the Iberville Parish justice of the peace courts; to provide
3	for the territorial jurisdiction of such courts; to provide relative to the election to the
4	offices of justice of the peace and constable; to provide for effectiveness; and to
5	provide for related matters.
6	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
7	Section 1. R.S. 13:2623 is hereby enacted to read as follows:
8	§2623. Territorial jurisdiction; Iberville Parish justice of the peace courts and
9	constables
10	A. The territorial limits of the justice of the peace districts and courts in
11	Iberville Parish shall be as follows:
12	(1) The first justice of the peace district and court shall consist of Precincts
13	1, 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7 of Iberville Parish.
14	(2) The second justice of the peace district and court shall consist of
15	Precincts 9, 10, 10B, 11, and 12 of Iberville Parish.
16	(3) The third justice of the peace district and court shall consist of Precincts
17	13, 14, 14A, 15, 17, and 18 of Iberville Parish.
18	(4) The fourth justice of the peace district and court shall consist of Precincts
19	19, 20, 21, and 22 of Iberville Parish.

1	(5) The fifth justice of the peace district and court shall consist of Precincts
2	15A, 16, 24, and 25 of Iberville Parish.
3	(6) The sixth justice of the peace district and court shall consist of Precincts
4	26, 27, 28, 29, 31, and 32 of Iberville Parish.
5	B. The persons elected to the offices of justice of the peace and constable for
6	such justice of the peace courts in Iberville Parish at the regularly scheduled election
7	in 2026 and their successors shall be elected from the districts provided in this
8	Section.
9	Section 2.(A) The precincts referenced in this Act are those contained in the file
10	named "2025 Precinct Shapefiles (01-16-2025)" available on the Legislature of Louisiana's
11	website on the effective date of this Section. The 2025 Precinct Shapefiles are based upon
12	those Voting Districts (VTDs) contained in the 2020 Census Redistricting TIGER/Line
13	Shapefiles for the State of Louisiana as those files have been modified and validated through
14	the data verification program of the Louisiana House of Representatives and the Louisiana
15	Senate to represent precinct changes submitted through January 16, 2025, to the Legislature
16	of Louisiana by parish governing authorities pursuant to the provisions of R.S. 18:532 and
17	532.1.
18	(B) When a precinct referenced in this Act has been subdivided by action of the
19	parish governing authority on a nongeographic basis or subdivided by action of the parish
20	governing authority on a geographic basis in accordance with the provisions of R.S.
21	18:532.1, the enumeration in this Act of the general precinct designation shall include all
22	nongeographic and all geographic subdivisions thereof, however such subdivisions may be
23	designated.
24	(C) The territorial limits of the districts as provided in this Act shall continue in
25	effect without change regardless of any changes made to the precincts by the parish
26	governing authority.
27	Section 3.(A) This Act shall become effective for purposes of the regularly
28	scheduled 2026 primary election for justices of peace and constables in Iberville Parish upon
29	signature by the governor or, if not signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for

- bills to become law without signature by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section
- 2 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved
- 3 by the legislature, this Act shall become effective for purposes of the regularly scheduled
- 4 2026 primary election for justices of peace and constables in Iberville Parish on the day
- 5 following such approval.

(B) This Act shall become effective for all other purposes on January 1, 2027.

Abstract: Provides for the jurisdictional boundaries and election districts of justice of the peace courts and constable districts in Iberville Parish.

Statistical summaries of <u>proposed law</u> including maps illustrating proposed election section boundaries accompany this digest. (Attached to the bill version on the internet.)

Presently there are six justice of the peace courts and justice of the peace districts in Iberville Parish. Each elects a justice of the peace and a constable.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides for the territorial jurisdiction of the six justice of the peace courts in Iberville Parish and provides that each district serves as an election district for justice of the peace and constable.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that the persons elected to the offices of justice of the peace and constable for such justice of the peace courts in Iberville Parish at the regularly scheduled election in 2026 and their successors shall be elected from the districts provided in <u>proposed law</u>.

<u>Proposed law</u> specifies that precincts referenced in district descriptions are those precincts contained in the file named "2025 Precinct Shapefiles (01-16-2025)" available on the legislature's website. Provides that the 2025 Precinct Shapefiles are based upon those Voting Districts (VTDs) contained in the 2020 Census Redistricting TIGER/Line Shapefiles for the State of La. as those files have been modified and validated through the data verification program of the La. House of Representatives and the La. Senate to represent precinct changes submitted through Jan. 16, 2025, to the Legislature of La. by parish governing authorities.

<u>Proposed law</u> also specifies that if any such precinct has been subdivided by action of the parish governing authority on a nongeographic basis or subdivided by action of the parish governing authority on a geographic basis in accordance with <u>present law</u>, the enumeration of the general precinct designation shall include all nongeographic and all geographic subdivisions thereof. Further provides that the territorial limits of the districts as enacted shall continue in effect until changed by law regardless of any subsequent change made to the precincts by the parish governing authority.
