SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 108

BY SENATORS JACKSON-ANDREWS AND BARROW

SPECIAL DAY/WEEK/MONTH. Designates Monday, May 12, 2025, as A Day Without Child Care at the Louisiana State Capitol.

1	A RESOLUTION
2	To designate Monday, May 12, 2025, as a Day Without Child Care at the Louisiana State
3	Capitol.
4	WHEREAS, early childhood education is the workforce behind the workforce,
5	supporting the employment of tens of thousands of working Louisiana parents; and
6	WHEREAS, early childhood education, from birth to kindergarten, is significantly
7	underfunded, resulting in many families unable to access necessary care; moreover, some
8	early educators leave the field because they cannot earn a livable wage; and
9	WHEREAS, this leaves families, providers, and businesses vulnerable, and costs
10	Louisiana's economy \$1.3 billion each year because of child care disruptions; and
11	WHEREAS, For Providers By Providers (4PXP), Louisiana's only provider-led ECE
12	organization, is leading the statewide coordination of the National Day Without Child Care
13	to elevate the voices of educators, families, and providers; and
14	WHEREAS, for generations, early childhood educators, parents, families, and
15	caregivers have been fighting for equitable access to affordable child care, better pay, and
16	working conditions for providers; and
17	WHEREAS, less than half of child care providers offer staff paid sick days, and
18	fewer than one-third provide health insurance or retirement benefits, highlighting the

ongoing challenges in ensuring a stable and supported early childhood education workforce;
 and

WHEREAS, among child care providers who lost staff in 2024, nearly half reported that departing employees left for jobs offering higher wages, with lower-paying providers experiencing staff turnover at higher rates than those able to offer more competitive compensation; and

- WHEREAS, most child care providers report increased staffing costs or challenges,
 including the need to pay higher wages or hire less experienced staff, and experience
 turnover as new staff leave within six months of starting; and
- WHEREAS, early childhood educators are among the lowest-paid professionals in
 the education sector, earning an average of \$10.63 an hour in Louisiana, despite the critical
 role they play in supporting children's development and learning during the most formative
 years; and
- WHEREAS, many early childhood teachers earn wages so low that they qualify for
 public assistance programs themselves, highlighting the disconnect between the value of
 their work and the compensation they receive; and
- WHEREAS, inadequate pay contributes to high turnover rates among early childhood
 educators, disrupting the stability and quality of care that young children need to thrive; and
 WHEREAS, low wages make it difficult to recruit and retain skilled, passionate
 professionals in the early childhood education workforce, placing additional strain on child
 care providers and families; and
- WHEREAS, the lack of accessible, high-quality early childhood education hinders
 Louisiana's capacity to attract and keep young professionals, resulting in a loss of talent,
 particularly in vital sectors like healthcare and education; and
- WHEREAS, on May 12, 2025, child care providers, teachers, families, and community members across Louisiana are joining the National Day Without Child Care to raise awareness about the urgent need for investment in early childhood education and to advocate for a fully funded child care system that powers the economy and supports working families; and

WHEREAS, investing in early childhood education is critical to supporting

1	Louisiana's working families, strengthening businesses and growing the state's economy,
2	ensuring every child has a strong start in life, and building a more prosperous future for all
3	communities; and
4	WHEREAS, early childhood education is as essential to a functioning economy as
5	roads, power, water, and broadband, and must be funded as critical infrastructure.
6	THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Senate of the Legislature of Louisiana
7	does hereby designate Monday, May 12, 2025, as A Day Without Child Care Day at the
8	Louisiana State Capitol.
9	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be transmitted to the
10	executive director of For Providers By Providers.
