LEVEES/BDS & DISTRICTS: Provides relative to the Southeast Louisiana Flood Protection Authority-East and Southeast Louisiana Flood Protection Authority-West Bank

AN ACT

2 To amend and reenact R.S. 38:330.1(C)(1)(a)(introductory paragraph) and (i) and (ii), (2)(b)

3 through (e), (3)(a) through (c), and (4) and (D) and to enact R.S. 4 38:330.1(C)(2)(a)(xii) and (f) and (g), relative to the Southeast Louisiana Flood 5 Protection Authority-East and the Southeast Louisiana Flood Protection Authority-6 West Bank; to change membership of the board of commissioners of the Southeast 7 Louisiana Flood Protection Authority-East; to appoint the executive director of the 8 Coastal Protection and Restoration Authority as secretary of the nominating 9 committee; to replace certain requirements of the regional directors, or in their 10 absence, the presidents of the boards of the Southeast Louisiana Flood Protection 11 Authority-East and the Southeast Louisiana Flood Protection Authority-West Bank with the chair; to change timeframes for notification of unexpected and expected 12 13 vacancies within the flood authorities, to reduce consecutive terms of 14 commissioners; and to provide for related matters.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

Section 1. R.S. 38:330.1(C)(1)(a)(introductory paragraph) and (i) and (ii), (2)(b)

through (e), (3)(a) through (c) and (4) and (D) are hereby amended and reenacted and R.S.

18 38:330.1(C)(2)(a)(xii) and (f) and (g) are hereby enacted to read as follows:

6	C.(1) There is hereby created a board of commissioners for each flood
7	protection authority as follows:
8	(a) The board of commissioners of the Southeast Louisiana Flood Protection
9	Authority-East shall be composed of nine members, of whom there shall be at least,
10	and not more than, one member from St. Bernard Parish, two members from
11	Jefferson Parish, and three members from Orleans Parish who shall reside within the
12	territorial jurisdiction of the authority, two members who do not reside in St. Bernard
13	Parish, Jefferson Parish, or Orleans Parish but reside within the territorial jurisdiction
14	of the authority, and one member with no jurisdictional or residency limitation. The
15	members shall be appointed by the governor from nominations submitted by the
16	nominating committee as follows:
17	(i) Five Four members who shall either be an engineer or a professional in
18	a related field such as geotechnical, hydrological, or environmental science. Of the
19	five four members, one member shall be a civil engineer.

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1 (b) Notwithstanding the provisions of Subparagraph (a) of this Paragraph for 2 the purpose of nominating persons to serve on the Southeast Louisiana Flood 3 Protection Authority-West Bank, the committee shall also include, a member or 4 designee of the West Bank Business and Industry Association and a faculty member or designee of Our Lady of Holy Cross College. 5 6 (c) The regional directors, or in the absence of a regional director, the 7 presidents of the boards of commissioners of the Southeast Louisiana Flood 8 Protection Authority-East and the Southeast Louisiana Flood Protection 9 Authority-West Bank executive director of the Coastal Protection and Restoration 10 Authority or his designee shall be the custodian of the records of the nominating 11 committee for their the respective flood authority. A term shall end on January first. A term for 24 nominating committee members whose eight-year term expires in 2025 shall end on 25 January 1, 2026. A former nominating committee member may be reappointed to 26 a nominating committee four years from the completion of a previous term. Service 27 of four or more years of an unexpired term shall constitute a term.

The committee shall submit one nominee two nominees for each unexpected vacancy in a position provided for in Item (1)(a)(i) or (b)(i) of this Subsection and shall submit two nominees for each unexpected vacancy in a position provided for in Item (1)(a)(ii) or (iii) of this Subsection or Item (1)(b)(ii) or (iii) of this Subsection. A majority vote of the total membership of the nominating committee shall be required to nominate persons to positions on the board. The committee shall submit its nominations for each unexpected vacancy to the governor for consideration no later than one hundred twenty ninety days after the notification of the regional directors, or in the absence of a regional director, the presidents of the boards of commissioners of the Southeast Louisiana Flood Protection Authority-East and the Southeast Louisiana Flood Protection Authority-West Bank of the occurrence of such unexpected vacancy. The governor shall appoint one of the nominees submitted by the committee within thirty days of submission of the nominations for any unexpected vacancy and submit such appointee appointees to the Senate for confirmation within forty-eight hours following the appointment, regardless of whether the legislature is in regular session.

within one hundred twenty ninety days after notification of the regional directors, or in the absence of a regional director, the presidents of the boards of commissioners of the Southeast Louisiana Flood Protection Authority-East and the Southeast Louisiana Flood Protection Authority-West Bank of the occurrence of such unexpected vacancy, the governor shall appoint a person persons meeting the requirements of this Section within thirty days of the expiration of such time and submit such appointee appointees to the Senate for confirmation within forty-eight

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hours following the appointment, regardless of whether the legislature is in regular session.

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(4)(a) Each July first, the board shall notify the chair of the nominating committee and regional directors, or in the absence of a regional director, the presidents of the boards of commissioners of the Southeast Louisiana Flood Protection Authority-East and the Southeast Louisiana Flood Protection Authority-West Bank of any vacancy which will occur on a board in the following year due to expiration of a term, hereinafter in this Paragraph referred to as "expected vacancy". The regional directors, or in the absence of a regional director, the presidents of the boards of commissioners of the Southeast Louisiana Flood Protection Authority-East and the Southeast Louisiana Flood Protection Authority-West Bank chair shall cause notification of each expected vacancy to be published in the official journal of the state and of each parish within the territorial jurisdiction of the authority. Such notification shall be published no later than thirty days following receipt by the chair regional directors, or in the absence of a regional director, the presidents of the boards of commissioners of the Southeast Louisiana Flood Protection Authority-East and the Southeast Louisiana Flood Protection Authority-West Bank of notice of an expected vacancy.

(b) The nominating committee shall follow the procedure outlined in Paragraph (3) of this Subsection. Any nominee confirmed by the Senate shall take office the day after the expiration of the term of the board member whose term is expiring. begin to meet and continue to meet as necessary to determine the nominations to send to the governor to fill each expected vacancy no sooner than thirty days after the latest date of publication set forth in Subparagraph (a) of this Paragraph and no later than ninety days after the latest date of publication set forth in Subparagraph (a) of this Paragraph. The committee shall consider each name submitted to the committee from whatever source and the committee members may propose names of persons to be considered. After review, the committee shall select

the nominees for each expected vacancy who meet the requirements of this Section. The committee shall submit one nominee for an expected vacancy in a position provided for in Item (1)(a)(i) or (b)(i) of this Subsection and shall submit two nominees for each expected vacancy in a position provided for in Item (1)(a)(ii) or (iii) of this Subsection. A majority vote of the total membership of the nominating committee shall be required to nominate persons to positions on the board. The committee shall submit its nominations for each expected vacancy to the governor for consideration no later than thirty days prior to the start of regular session. The governor shall appoint one of the nominations and shall submit such appointee to the Senate for confirmation within forty-eight hours after the appointment is made, regardless of whether the legislature is in regular session. If confirmed, the appointee shall take office the day after the expiration of the term of the board member whose term is expiring.

(c) If the nominating committee fails to submit a nominee for an expected vacancy thirty days prior to the start of regular session, the governor shall appoint

vacancy thirty days prior to the start of regular session, the governor shall appoint a person meeting the requirements of this Section. The governor shall submit such appointee to the Senate for confirmation within forty-eight hours after the appointment is made, regardless of whether the legislature is in session. If confirmed, the appointee shall take office the day after the expiration of the term of the board member whose term is expiring.

(d) In the event that the Senate fails to confirm an appointment made pursuant to this Paragraph by taking no action at all or voting not to confirm an appointee in open session by the end of a regular session, an unexpected vacancy shall occur the day after the expiration of the term of the board member whose term is expiring and such unexpected vacancy shall be filled in the manner set forth in Paragraph (3) of this Subsection. Any appointee whom the Senate failed to confirm shall not be appointed to the same position during any recess of the legislature.

1	D.(1) The members of each board initially appointed shall at their first
2	meeting determine by lot their terms of office, which terms shall commence
3	immediately upon their appointment and shall expire, respectively, as follows:
4	(a) For the board of the Southeast Louisiana Flood Protection Authority East:
5	two members in one year, three members in two years, three members in three years,
6	and three members in four years, from the first day of July immediately succeeding
7	such appointment.
8	(b) For the board of the Southeast Louisiana Flood Protection Authority
9	West Bank: one member in one year, two members in two years, two members in
10	three years, and two members in four years, from the first day of July immediately
11	succeeding such appointment.
12	(2)(1) All commissioners thereafter appointed, except a commissioner

16	term, such service shall constitute a term. A former board member may be

19	(3)(2) Notwithstanding R.S. 24:14(K), no person shall serve on the board
20	beyond the expiration of a term unless reappointed to a position on the board by the
21	process required by either Paragraph (C)(3) or (4) of this Section.

Abstract: Reduces the membership of the Southeast Louisiana Flood Protection Authority-East with engineering or science-related backgrounds and increases the membership of the Southeast Louisiana Flood Protection Authority-East with those with disciplines other than science-related backgrounds. Appoints the executive director of the Coastal Protection and Restoration Authority as secretary and custodian of the

nominating committee. Replaces certain requirements of the regional directors, or in their absence, the presidents of the boards of the Southeast Louisiana Flood Protection Authority-East and Southeast Louisiana Flood Protection Authority-West with the chair. Changes timeframes for notification of unexpected and expected vacancies within the flood authority. Reduces consecutive terms of commissioners.

<u>Present law</u> creates the board of commissioners (board) for each flood protection authority which includes the board of the Southeast La. Flood Protection Authority-East (SLFP-E) composed of the following nine members of whom there shall be at least one member from St. Bernard Parish, two members from Jefferson Parish, and three members from Orleans Parish who must reside within the territorial jurisdiction of the authority. These members are appointed by the governor from nominations submitted by the nominating committee:

- (1) Five members in an engineering or a science-related field with one of the members, being a civil engineer.
- (2) Two members in any other discipline other than that occurring in <u>present law</u> with at least 10 years of professional experience in that discipline.

<u>Proposed law</u> modifies <u>present law</u> by adding two members who do not reside in St. Bernard Parish, Jefferson Parish, or Orleans Parish but reside within the territorial jurisdiction of the authority and one member with no jurisdictional or residency limitation. Further reduces the number of members with engineering or science-related backgrounds <u>from</u> five <u>to</u> four and increasing the number of members in any other discipline other than that occurring in a science-related field <u>from</u> two <u>to</u> three.

<u>Present law</u> requires the nominating committee for each board to be composed of members or designees from the following entities:

- (1) The Public Affairs Research Council of La.
- (2) The Council for A Better La.
- (3) The La. Geological Survey at LSU.
- (4) The Assoc. of State Floodplain Managers.
- (5) The National Society of Black Engineers.
- (6) The College of Engineering at the University of N.O.
- (7) The School of Science and Engineering at Tulane University.
- (8) The College of Engineering at Southern University and Agricultural and Mechanical College.
- (9) The College of Engineering at LSU.
- (10) The American Society of Civil Engineers.
- (11) The La. Engineering Society.

<u>Proposed law modifies present law</u> by including the executive director or designee of the Coastal Protection and Restoration Authority (CPRA) as a member.

<u>Present law</u> requires the nominating committee also include a member or designee of the West Bank Business and Industry Assoc. and of Our Lady of Holy Cross College.

Proposed law retains present law.

Present law requires the regional directors, or in their absence, the presidents of the boards of the SLFP-E and the Southeast Louisiana Flood Protection Authority-West Bank (SLFP-W) be the custodian of records of the nominating committee for their respective flood authority. Further requires the chair of either the SLFP-E or the SLFP-W nominating committee, or in his absence, the regional directors, or in the absence of a regional director, the presidents of the boards to call the meeting of the committee for their respective flood authority. Additionally, requires the regional directors, or in their absence, the presidents of the SLFP-E and SLFP-W boards or their designees, serve as secretary for the nominating committee for their respective flood authority.

<u>Proposed law</u> modifies <u>present law</u> by replacing the regional directors, or in their absence, the presidents of the boards of the SLFP-E and the SLFP-W with the executive director of the CPRA or his designee to be custodian of records of the nominating committee for their respective flood authority. Further replaces the regional directors, or in their absence, the presidents of the boards of the SLFP-E and the SLFP-W with the chair to call the meeting of the committee for the respective flood authority.

<u>Present law</u> requires all nominating committee members be appointed for eight years. Further provides that a former nominating committee member be reappointed to a nominating committee four years from the completion of a previous terms and that service for four or more years of an unexpired term shall constitute a term.

<u>Proposed law</u> modifies <u>present law</u> by including a term end date of Jan. 1st at the end of each term. Further requires that a term for nominating committee members whose eight-year term expires in 2025 will end on Jan. 1, 2026.

<u>Present law</u> defines the nominating committee as a "public body" and specifies that the Open Meetings Law and Public Records Law applies to such committee.

<u>Proposed law</u> allows the nominating committee members attend meetings and convene remotely.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the CPRA assign a staff representative to assist the nominating committee in work and preparation of meetings.

Proposed law requires the nominating committee be represented by the attorney general.

<u>Present law</u> requires the board notify the chair of the nominating committee and regional directors, or in their absence, the presidents of the boards of the SLFP-E and the SLFP-W of unexpected vacancy within the flood authority. Clarifies that a vacancy is unexpected whenever it occurs for a reason other than the expiration of a term. Requires the regional directors, or in their absence, the presidents of the boards of the SLFP-E and the SLFP-W cause notification of the unexpected vacancy to be published in the official journal of the state and of each parish within the territorial jurisdiction of the authority. Further requires the publishing of the notice of the unexpected vacancy no later 30 days following receipt by the regional directors, or in their absence, the presidents of the boards of the SLFP-E and the SLFP-W.

<u>Proposed law</u> modifies <u>present law</u> by eliminating the requirements for the board to notify the regional directors, or in their absence, the presidents of the boards of the SLFP-E and the SLFP-W of the unexpected vacancy within the flood district. Further replaces the regional directors, or in their absence, the presidents of the boards of the SLFP-E and the SLFP-W with the chair to provide notice of an unexpected vacancy and publish it in the official journal of the state and of each parish within the territorial jurisdiction of the authority.

<u>Present law</u> requires the nominating committee meet to determine the nominations for each unexpected vacancy within the time limitations set forth in <u>present law</u>. Further requires the committee consider each name submitted and select the nominees for each unexpected vacancy. Further, the committee shall submit one nominee for each vacancy. Additionally, requires a majority vote for nominations and such nominations be submitted to the governor for consideration no later than 120 days after the notification of the occurrence of such unexpected vacancy to the regional directors, or in their absence, the presidents of the boards of the SLFP-E and the SLFP-W. Requires the governor appoint one of the nominees submitted by the committee within 30 days of submission of the nominations and submit an appointee to the Senate for confirmation 48 hours from the appointment.

<u>Proposed law modifies present law</u> by eliminating the 30 day and no later than 90 day requirement for publication in the official journal. Further increases the number of nominees the committee must submit for unexpected vacancies from one to two.

<u>Proposed law modifies present law</u> by reducing the time frame for submission of nominees to fill the unexpected vacancies <u>from</u> 120 days <u>to</u> 90 days after notification. Further eliminates the 48 hour requirement for submission of appointees to the Senate to fill the unexpected vacancy.

<u>Present law</u> requires the governor appoint a qualified person within the time limitations set forth in <u>present law</u> if the nominating committee fails to submit a nominee within 120 days after the notice of an unexpected vacancy to the regional directors, or in the absence of a regional director, the presidents of the boards of the SLFP-E and the SLFP-W.

<u>Proposed law</u> modifies <u>present law</u> by restricting the nominating committee's timeframe for submission of a nominee to fill the unexpected vacancy <u>from</u> 120 days <u>to</u> 90 days after notification of the vacancy. Further eliminates the requirement that the regional directors, or in their absence, the presidents of the boards of commissioners of the SLFP-E and SLFP-W notify the nominating committee of the vacancy.

<u>Present law</u> requires the board notify the chair of the nominating committee and regional directors, or in their absence, the presidents of the boards of the SLFP-E and the SLFP-W of any expected vacancy occurring the following year due to expiration of a term. Further requires the regional directors, or in their absence, the presidents of the SLFP-E and the SLFP-W boards publish a notification of each expected vacancy in the official journal of the state and of each parish within the territorial jurisdiction of the authority. Provides that such notification be published no later than 30 days after receipt by the regional directors, or in their absence, the presidents of the SLFP-E and the SLFP-W boards.

<u>Proposed law</u> modifies <u>present law</u> by eliminating the requirement that the board notify the regional directors, or in their absence, the presidents of the boards of the SLFP-E and the SLFP-W of any expected vacancy occurring the following year due to expiration of a term. Further replaces the regional directors, or in their absence, the presidents of the SLFP-E and the SLFP-W boards with chair to provide notice of an unexpected vacancy and publish it in the official journal of the state and of each parish within the territorial jurisdiction of the authority.

<u>Present law</u> requires the nominating committee meet to determine the nominations to fill each expected vacancy at least 30 days after the latest date of the notice publication and no later than 90 days after the latest date of notice publication set forth in <u>present law</u>. Further requires the committee consider each name submitted and select the nominees for each expected vacancy who meet the requirements of <u>present law</u>. Additionally, requires the committee submit one nominee for an expected vacancy in a position provided for in <u>present law</u> and submit two nominees for each expected vacancy in a position provided for in <u>present law</u>. Provides that a majority vote is needed to nominate persons to positions on the board. The committee shall submit its nominations for each expected vacancy to the

governor for consideration no later than 30 days prior to the start of regular session Provides the time limitations for the appointment of nominees.

<u>Proposed law</u> modifies <u>present law</u> by requiring the nominating committee follow the procedures in <u>present law</u>. Further removes the timeframe for the nominating committee to provide notice publication in the official journal of each expected vacancy; removes the requirement that the committee consider each name submitted and select the nominees for each expected vacancy who meet the requirements of <u>present law</u>; that a majority vote is needed to nominate persons to positions on the board; that the committee shall submit its nominations for each expected vacancy to the governor for consideration no later than 30 days prior to the start of regular session; and provides the time limitations for the appointment of nominees.

<u>Proposed law</u> removes <u>present law</u>.

<u>Present law</u> requires members of each board, at their first meeting, determine by lot their terms of office, which terms commence immediately upon their appointment and their expiration including all commissioners appointed, except a commissioner appointed to fill an unexpired term. Further requires the commissioners be appointed for staggered terms of four years and prohibits a member from serving more than two consecutive terms. Specifies that serving two years or more of an unexpired term constitutes a term. Authorizes a former board member be reappointed to the board after sitting out four years from the completion of his last consecutive term.

<u>Proposed law</u> modifies <u>present law</u> by allowing a member to serve three consecutive terms instead of two but otherwise retains present law.

<u>Present law</u> prohibits a person from serving on the board beyond the expiration of a term unless reappointed to a position on the board through the process required by present law.

Proposed law retains present law.
