COMMENDATIONS. Commends Danny Granger on being inducted into the 2025 class of the Louisiana Sports Hall of Fame.

2	To commend Danny Granger on being inducted into the 2025 class of the Louisiana Sports
3	Hall of Fame.
4	WHEREAS, Danny Granger was born on April 20, 1983, in New Orleans, Louisiana,
5	and is a proud graduate of Grace King High School; and
6	WHEREAS, Granger played collegiate basketball at Bradley University and the
7	University of New Mexico, where he compiled career averages of 16.7 points and 8.2
8	rebounds per game; and
9	WHEREAS, in his senior season (2004-2005), Granger was the only player in
10	National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) Division I basketball to average at least
11	18.8 points and 8.9 rebounds per game, which distinguished him as one of the most complete
12	and dominant players in the college game; and
13	WHEREAS, Granger was selected seventeenth overall in the first round of the 2005
14	National Basketball Association (NBA) Draft by the Indiana Pacers and he went on to play
15	ten seasons in the NBA, including eight and one-half seasons with the Pacers, followed by
16	playing with the Los Angeles Clippers and the Miami Heat; and
17	WHEREAS, during his NBA career, Granger played in five hundred eighty-six
18	games, started in four hundred twenty-five of them, and maintained career averages of 16.8

points, 4.9 rebounds, and 1.9 assists per game; and

2	WHEREAS, Granger reached the peak of his professional career between 2008 and
3	2012, a five-year stretch during which he averaged 21.6 points and 5.4 rebounds over three
4	hundred fifty games and earned selection to the 2009 NBA All-Star Game as a starter; and
5	WHEREAS, his best season came in 2008–2009, when he averaged 25.8 points and
6	5.1 rebounds per game and solidified his status as one of the NBA's elite players; and
7	WHEREAS, Granger was a member of the United States national team that won the
8	gold medal at the 2010 International Basketball Federation (FIBA) World Championships,
9	and brought international recognition to American basketball and represented Louisiana on
10	the world stage; and
11	WHEREAS, despite his career being impacted by injuries, including knee tendinitis
12	and a strained calf that limited his appearances in later seasons, Granger's perseverance and
13	professionalism earned widespread respect across the league; and
14	WHEREAS, Danny Granger remains a role model for aspiring athletes in Louisiana
15	and beyond, having demonstrated excellence, resilience, and dedication throughout his
16	career.
17	THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby
18	commend Danny Granger on being inducted into the 2025 class of the Louisiana Sports Hall
19	of Fame.
20	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be transmitted to
21	Danny Granger.
