HB 558 2025 Regular Session Davis

HIGHER EDUCATION: Provides relative to initial eligibility requirements for the M.J. Foster Promise Program

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### **DIGEST**

<u>Present law</u> provides for the M.J. Foster Promise Program, a financial assistance program for students attending a two-year public postsecondary education institution or proprietary school who are enrolled in certain qualified programs.

<u>Present law</u> provides for specific initial eligibility requirements, including not having a conviction for any crime of violence listed in <u>present law</u> (R.S. 14:2(B)).

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> relative to having a conviction for the following crimes making a person ineligible for the program:

- (1) Solicitation for murder.
- (2) First degree murder.
- (3) Second degree murder.
- (4) Manslaughter.
- (5) Aggravated battery.
- (6) Second degree battery.
- (7) Aggravated assault.
- (8) Aggravated kidnapping of a child.
- (9) Aggravated or first degree rape.
- (10) Forcible or second degree rape.
- (11) Simple or third degree rape.
- (12) Sexual battery.
- (13) Second degree sexual battery.
- (14) Intentional exposure to AIDS virus.
- (15) Aggravated kidnapping.
- (16) Second degree kidnapping.
- (17) Simple kidnapping.
- (18) Aggravated arson.
- (19) Aggravated criminal damage to property.
- (20) Aggravated burglary.
- (21) Armed robbery.
- (22) First degree robbery.

(23)False imprisonment; offender armed with dangerous weapon. (24)Assault by drive-by shooting. (25)Aggravated crime against nature. (26)Carjacking. (27)Molestation of a juvenile or a person with a physical or mental disability. (28)Terrorism. (29)Aggravated second degree battery. (30)Aggravated assault upon a peace officer. (31)Aggravated assault with a firearm. (32)Armed robbery; use of firearm; additional penalty. (33)Second degree robbery. (34)Disarming of a peace officer. (35) Stalking. - (53) Aggravated abortion by dismemberment.
- (54) Battery of emergency room personnel, emergency services personnel, or a healthcare professional.
- (55) Possession of a firearm or carrying of a concealed weapon by a person convicted of certain felonies in violation of present law (R.S. 14:95.1(D)).
- (56) Distribution of fentanyl or carfentanil punishable under <u>present law</u> (R.S. 40:967(B)(4)(f)).
- (57) Distribution of heroin punishable under present law (R.S. 40:966(B)(3)(b)).
- (58) Simple burglary of an inhabited dwelling when a person is present in the dwelling, house, apartment, or other structure.
- (59) Illegal use of weapons or dangerous instrumentalities.
- (60) First degree vehicular negligent injuring, when the operator's blood alcohol concentration exceeds 0.20 percent by weight based on grams of alcohol per one hundred cubic centimeters of blood.

<u>Proposed law</u> authorizes a person to be eligible who has had a conviction for certain crimes. The exception applies to the following crimes listed in <u>present law</u> (R.S. 13:5401(B)(1)(f)):

- (1) Simple robbery.
- (2) Purse snatching.

## Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

The Committee Amendments Proposed by <u>House Committee on Education</u> to the original bill:

- 1. Restore <u>present law</u> relative to adding back the following crimes to the list that deem a person who was convicted of such crimes ineligible for the M.J. Foster Promise Program:
  - (a) Disarming of a peace officer.
  - (b) False imprisonment; offender armed with dangerous weapon.
  - (c) Aggravated arson.
  - (d) Home invasion.
