SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 64

FLOODS/FLOODING. To continue the Comite River Diversion Canal/Amite River Basin Task Force.

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION 1 2 To continue the Comite River Diversion Canal/Amite River Basin Task Force. WHEREAS, the Amite River and its tributary, the Comite River, are major causes 3 of catastrophic flooding in the Greater Baton Rouge Metropolitan Area and all impacted 4 5 downstream communities of East Baton Rouge Parish, Livingston Parish, and Ascension 6 Parish; and WHEREAS, during the floods of 1983 and 2016, substantial portions of the parishes 8 of East Baton Rouge, Livingston, and Ascension were inundated with flood waters; and 9 WHEREAS, the purpose of the Comite River Diversion Canal Project is to divert 10 flood waters from the upper Comite River to the Mississippi River; at its maximum capacity, 11 the project will divert twenty thousand cubic feet per second by gravity flow; and WHEREAS, once completed, the Comite River Diversion Canal could divert fifty 12 13 percent of the flood waters from the upper Comite River, which would substantially reduce 14 flood stages along the lower Comite and Amite rivers; and WHEREAS, following the displacement of thousands of residents from the New 15 16 Orleans area after Hurricane Katrina, East Baton Rouge Parish experienced an explosive 17 population growth and is now the most populous parish in the state, making the Comite 18 River Diversion Canal Project all the more important and urgently significant; and

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1	WHEREAS, the work of the task force originally began pursuant to House
2	Concurrent Resolution No. 51 of the 2014 Regular Session and continued pursuant to House
3	Concurrent Resolution No. 66 of the 2015 Regular Session, House Concurrent Resolution
4	No. 39 of the 2016 Regular Session, House Concurrent Resolution No. 90 of the 2019
5	Regular Session, House Concurrent Resolution No. 62 of the 2020 Regular Session, House
6	Concurrent Resolution No. 17 of the 2022 Regular Session and Senate Concurrent
7	Resolution No. 25 of the 2024 Regular Session.
8	THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby
9	continue the Comite River Diversion Canal/Amite River Basin Task Force and authorizes
10	the task force to meet and make recommendations to the legislature and the appropriate state
11	and federal agencies on actions necessary to complete the construction and maintenance of
12	the Comite River Diversion Canal Project, including strategies to comply with mitigation
13	requirements and right-of-way acquisitions, mitigation of flooding caused by the Comite
14	River, other required mitigation projects and flood plain planning throughout the Amite
15	River Basin, and the actions of the watershed initiative pertaining to the Amite River Basin
16	to maintain transparency to the citizens of the Amite River Basin.
17	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force shall be comprised of the
18	following members:
19	(1) The state senator for Senate District 13, who shall serve as the chairman of the
20	task force;
21	(2) Two members of the Senate appointed by the president of the Senate whose
22	districts are directly impacted by the Amite River Basin;
23	(3) One member of the House of Representatives appointed by the speaker of the
24	House of Representatives whose district corresponds with Senate District 13, who shall serve
25	as the vice chairman of the task force;
26	(4) Two members of the House of Representatives appointed by the speaker of the
27	House of Representatives, whose districts are directly impacted by the Amite River Basin;
28	(5) One member appointed by the members of the Louisiana congressional
29	delegation representing the district in which the Amite River Basin is located;

(6) The secretary of the Department of Transportation and Development, or his

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1	designee;
2	(7) The executive director of the Coastal Protection and Restoration Authority, or his
3	designee;
4	(8) One member appointed by the chairman of the task force who is a former member
5	of the Amite River Basin Drainage and Water Conservation District board of commissioners;
6	(9) One member appointed by the director of the Louisiana Geological Survey;
7	(10) The director of the Department of Public Works of East Baton Rouge Parish,
8	or his designee;
9	(11) One member appointed by the president of the Louisiana Home Builders
10	Association, who is a home builder within the area impacted by the Amite River Basin
11	District;
12	(12) One member appointed by Louisiana REALTORS who is a realtor in the area
13	impacted by the Amite River Basin District;
14	(13) One member appointed by the director of the Federal Emergency Management
15	Agency (FEMA) Louisiana Recovery Office;
16	(14) One member appointed by the Louisiana Landowners Association, Incorporated,
17	who is a landowner in the area impacted by the Amite River Basin District;
18	(15) One member appointed by the president of the board of commissioners for the
19	Amite River Basin Drainage and Water Conservation District;
20	(16) The executive director of the Louisiana State Licensing Board for Contractors,
21	or his designee.
22	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that each designating authority shall submit the
23	names of designees appointed to the task force to the chairperson no later than July 30, 2025.
24	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED the task force shall convene its first meeting no later
25	than September 30, 2025, at the call of the chairperson.
26	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a majority of the task force shall constitute a
27	quorum for the transaction of business. All official actions of the task force shall require the
28	affirmative vote of a majority of the members.
29	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the members of the task force shall serve

without compensation, except per diem or expense reimbursement to which they may be

individually entitled as members of their constituent organizations.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force shall receive staff support from the Senate and may receive additional assistance from one or more of the entities from which the task force membership is designated or appointed.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force shall submit recommendations to the Senate Committee on Transportation, Highways and Public Works, and the House Committee on Transportation, Highways and Public Works on a continuing basis as necessary and any reports submitted shall be reported to the committees and the David R. Poynter Legislative Research Library, as required by R.S. 24:771.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force shall terminate upon the completion of the project or December 31, 2027, whichever occurs first.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be transmitted to the president of the Senate, the speaker of the House of Representatives, the Louisiana congressional delegation representing the district in which the Amite River Basin is located, the secretary of the Department of Transportation and Development, the executive director of the Coastal Protection and Restoration Authority, the president of the Amite River Basin Drainage and Water Conservation District, the director of the Louisiana Geological Survey, the director of the Department of Public Works of East Baton Rouge Parish, the president of the Louisiana Home Builders Association, the president of Louisiana REALTORS, the director of the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Louisiana Recovery Office, the president of the Louisiana Landowners Association, Inc., and the executive director of the Louisiana State Licensing Board for Contractors.
