COMMENDATIONS. Commends The Center for Literacy and Learning and designates May 13, 2025, as Literacy Day at the Louisiana State Capitol.

1	A RESOLUTION
2	To commend The Center for Literacy and Learning for its leadership in advancing literacy
3	statewide; to commend historic gains in fourth grade literacy rates in Louisiana; and
4	to designate Tuesday, May 13, 2025, as Literacy Day at the Louisiana State Capitol.
5	WHEREAS, students who do not read proficiently by the end of the third grade are
6	four times more likely to drop out of school and those who lack basic reading proficiency
7	are nearly six times more likely to leave school without earning a diploma; and
8	WHEREAS, dyslexia, a specific learning disability that affects as many as one in five
9	individuals, presents a significant barrier to reading success without proper support; and
10	WHEREAS, literacy is foundational to a student's academic success, long-term
11	opportunity, and personal empowerment; and
12	WHEREAS, in 2022, seventy-two percent of Louisiana's fourth grade students did
13	not read proficiently, placing the state forty-second in the nation for fourth grade reading
14	achievement; and
15	WHEREAS, in 2024, Louisiana made historic progress by climbing twenty-six
16	places in national rankings to sixteenth in the nation for fourth grade reading, according to
17	the National Assessment of Educational Progress (NEAP); and
18	WHEREAS, The Center for Literacy and Learning, founded in 1992, has spent thirty-

1	three years implementing evidence-based instructional and coaching practices that improve
2	teaching and increase student learning outcomes from birth to 12th grade; and
3	WHEREAS, The Center for Literacy and Learning draws on more than three hundred
4	fifty years of professional education experience, focusing on closing the achievement gap
5	through targeted, high-quality professional development for educators of at-risk students;
6	and
7	WHEREAS, The Center for Literacy and Learning employs a comprehensive literacy
8	wraparound approach, providing services to educators, families, and communities that
9	support learning both inside and outside the classroom; and
10	WHEREAS, in 2019, The Center for Literacy and Learning successfully advocated
11	for the creation of the Early Literacy Commission and, in 2023, for the establishment of the
12	Louisiana Literacy Advisory Commission, both of which are instrumental in shaping the
13	state's literacy policies; and
14	WHEREAS, in partnership with the Louisiana Department of Education, The Center
15	for Literacy and Learning launched the Literacy Coaching Program in 2020; and
16	WHEREAS, in 2023, The Center for Literacy and Learning launched the Louisiana
17	pilot program for family engagement in literacy education; and
18	WHEREAS, improving literacy across Louisiana is vital to building a strong
19	workforce, creating high-quality jobs, and sustaining long-term economic growth.
20	THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Senate of the Legislature of Louisiana
21	does hereby commend the dedicated work of The Center for Literacy and Learning, celebrate
22	the notable progress in fourth grade literacy scores in Louisiana, and designate Tuesday,
23	May 13, 2025, as Literacy Day at the Louisiana State Capitol.
