COMMENDATIONS. Commemorates the 175<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the opening of Louisiana's Old State Capitol as home to the Louisiana Legislature in 1850.

1	A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION
2	To commemorate the 175th anniversary of the opening of Louisiana's Old State Capitol as
3	home to the Louisiana Legislature in 1850.
4	WHEREAS, Louisiana citizens voted in 1845 to establish the capital sixty miles from
5	New Orleans and in 1847 the Baton Rouge City Council and Police Jury transferred
6	approximately five acres of land to the state of Louisiana; and
7	WHEREAS, architect James Dakin said the capitol should have a "distinctive, classic
8	and commanding character", and his castellated Gothic design was chosen; and
9	WHEREAS, the building served as the Capitol from 1850 until 1862, when a fire
10	destroyed the interior during the Civil War; and
11	WHEREAS, the state restored and expanded the Capitol in 1882, adding a fourth
12	floor and the renowned stained glass dome and windows, and was home to innumerable
13	historic events; and
14	WHEREAS, it served as the statehouse until 1932 when the new Capitol opened; and
15	WHEREAS, this building housed various state offices until 1991 when it was
16	transferred to the secretary of state's office and, with appropriations from the legislature, was
17	restored to its 1882 grandeur; and
18	WHEREAS, the Old State Capitol now serves as a museum celebrating the rich

political and governmental history of Louisiana; and

2	WHEREAS, the museum has twice been accredited by the American Alliance of
3	Museums, a standard held by only six percent of museums nationwide; and
4	WHEREAS, the museum is home to the Youth Legislature program and is visited
5	by more than 10,000 students annually; and
6	WHEREAS, the Old State Capitol has offered countless free programs, exhibits, and
7	educational opportunities to the public to advance its mission of educating the public about
8	the democratic process and inspiring engaged citizenship; and
9	WHEREAS, the Old State Capitol is visited by more than 50,000 visitors annually,
10	including tourists from around the world; and
11	WHEREAS, the Old State Capitol continues to tell the story of Louisiana's history,
12	a state like no other, and enhances the community's cultural, educational, and economic
13	development.
14	THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby
15	commemorate Louisiana's Old State Capitol on the 175th anniversary of its opening as the
16	capitol and recognizes the critical role the museum plays in educating citizens about our
17	state's political history and the need for an engaged citizenry.
18	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby
19	celebrate the enduring legacy of the Old State Capitol, ensuring that this historic site
20	continues to inspire generations to come.
21	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be transmitted to
22	Louisiana Secretary of State Nancy Landry.
