1	A RESOLUTION
2	To express the sincere condolences of the Senate of the Legislature of Louisiana upon the
3	passing of James Hardy "Jimmy" Gill Jr., and to honor his life of service, faith, and
4	extraordinary contributions to his community, state, and country.
5	WHEREAS, it is with deep sorrow that the Senate of the Legislature of Louisiana
6	learned of the passing of James Hardy "Jimmy" Gill Jr., a faithful servant of Christ, a
7	devoted husband, father, grandfather, great-grandfather, veteran, attorney, businessman,
8	educator, and minister, on June 13, 2024; and
9	WHEREAS, Jimmy Gill was born in Baton Rouge on December 4, 1937, and
10	educated primarily in the Catholic school system, before graduating from Baton Rouge High
11	School in 1955, where he was voted "Class Wit"; and
12	WHEREAS, he served honorably in the United States Marine Corps, both in active
13	duty and reserves. Stationed primarily in Hawaii from 1957 to 1958, he achieved the rank
14	of corporal, and was honorably discharged in 1963; and
15	WHEREAS, Jimmy earned a Bachelor of Science degree in business from Louisiana
16	State University in 1961 and a Juris Doctorate from Loyola Law School in 1964, marking
17	the beginning of a distinguished and diverse professional career; and
18	WHEREAS, he practiced law in Baton Rouge, working at different times with

notable partners such as Frank Foil, Don Beckner, and Larry Bankston, in a decades-long
 practice specializing in international engineering, procurement and construction contracts,
 administrative law, construction and product project development, multinational project
 financing, contract negotiations and administration, state and federal government relations,
 and pre-litigation dispute resolution; and

WHEREAS, Jimmy also served in management roles in business and banking, both
 domestically and internationally, including as a construction trade association executive with
 BRICA, founding and leading two construction and maintenance firms, ORET and
 TeroTechnology, and serving as president of Anglo-American Bank Shares and director of
 Baton Rouge Bank and Trust; and

WHEREAS, Jimmy transitioned into academia in the 1990s, serving as an adjunct
 professor and later as the Contractors Educational Trust Fund Endowed Chair in the
 Department of Construction Management at LSU, where he influenced countless students
 and received national recognition for excellence in teaching; and

WHEREAS, he was honored with numerous accolades, including the 2003 W.A.
Klinger Outstanding Educator Award and the 2003 AGC Outstanding Educator Award,
underscoring his enduring impact on the education community; and

WHEREAS, throughout his remarkable life, Jimmy remained steadfast in his
Christian faith, having come to salvation through the grace of God on December 21, 1974,
and was ordained as a minister through the Berean Bible Fellowship in 1991; and

WHEREAS, his heart for ministry was evident in his service to retirement communities and as president of Radio Bible Courses, Ltd., sharing the gospel and teaching scripture with humility, conviction, and passion; and

WHEREAS, he is remembered with deep affection by his beloved wife of more than
sixty-two years, Barbara Elaine Pruyn Gill, his children, James Hardy "Buddy" Gill III, and
Laura Elaine Gill Showalter and her husband, Brian, grandchildren and great-grandchildren,
many life-long friends, and all who were blessed to know him; and

WHEREAS, Jimmy Gill's Christ-centered life reflects the timeless values of faith,
integrity, leadership, and service, and his legacy will continue to inspire those who follow
in his footsteps, both personally and professionally.
