<u>Present law</u> (R.S. 33:1221) provides that police jurors shall serve four-year terms.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> but provides that no person who has been elected to serve as a police juror in DeSoto Parish for more than two and one-half terms in three consecutive terms shall be eligible to be a police juror for the succeeding term.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that the limit on the number of terms a member of the police jury in DeSoto Parish may serve shall be subject to approval of a majority of the electors voting at an election held for that purpose in accordance with <u>present law</u> (La. Election Code).

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that <u>proposed law</u> shall have prospective application only and shall not apply to police jurors elected prior to the effective date of <u>proposed law</u>.

Effective August 1, 2025.

Summary of Amendments Adopted by Senate

Senate Floor Amendments to engrossed bill

1. Provides for an exact election date for purposes of determining if there shall be limits placed on the number of terms a member of the police jury in DeSoto Parish may serve.

Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

The Committee Amendments Proposed by <u>House Committee on Municipal, Parochial</u> and Cultural Affairs to the reengrossed bill:

1. Remove specified election date and provide that the limit on the number of terms a police juror in DeSoto Parish may serve shall be subject to approval by a majority of electors voting at an election held for that purpose in accordance with the La. Election Code.
