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HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 306

TRANSPORTATION: Urges and requests the Department of Transportation and Development to establish the Urban Infrastructure Planning Task Force

A RESOLUTION

2	To urge and request the Department of Transportation and Development to establish the
3	Urban Infrastructure Planning Task Force; to identify the key infrastructure project
4	needs in urban areas; to assess the financial feasibility of urban infrastructure
5	projects; to assess the potential impacts of urban infrastructure projects; to evaluate
6	the efficiency of urban infrastructure projects; and to evaluate ways urban
7	infrastructure projects improve the quality of life of Louisiana citizens.
8	WHEREAS, according to the 2023 Bipartisan Infrastructure Law/Infrastructure
9	Investment and Jobs Act and the Inflation Reduction Act Annual Report, over ten billion two
10	hundred million dollars in funding was allocated to support over seven hundred awards and
11	projects in Louisiana; and
12	WHEREAS, a backlog is defined as the work that a company or organization has
13	contracted to perform, but has yet to be started or completed; and
14	WHEREAS, Louisiana's state highway and bridge needs have increased
15	approximately six billion six million dollars from 2013 to 2022; and
16	WHEREAS, according to the secretary of the Department of Transportation and
17	Development, Louisiana currently faces an estimated eighteen million nine hundred
18	thousand dollars in backlog for highway and bridge needs; and
19	WHEREAS, according to the city of New Orleans's Office of Strategic Engagement
20	and Special Projects, there are currently approximately two hundred infrastructure projects;
21	and

1	WHEREAS, according to Fox 8 Local First, many projects in New Orleans are taking
2	more than twice the time allocated in the original contracts to be completed; and
3	WHEREAS, according to MOVEBR, there are currently over seventy transportation
4	infrastructure projects in Baton Rouge; and
5	WHEREAS, since 2022, only nine transportation infrastructure projects have been
6	completed; and
7	WHEREAS, according to the Louisiana Section of the American Society of Civil
8	Engineers, Louisiana's report card for infrastructure is reportedly a "D+", meaning it is
9	poorly executed; and
10	WHEREAS, approximately thirteen and a half percent of Louisiana bridges are
11	structurally deficient; and
12	WHEREAS, with the increase in travel of Louisiana drivers, delays in urban
13	infrastructure projects are having tremendous negative economic impacts on the traveling
14	public, businesses, refineries, and chemical plants; and
15	WHEREAS, according to the International Journal of Transportation Science and
16	Technology, Louisiana's interstate system has grown sixty-one percent between 2000 and
17	2019; and
18	WHEREAS, in 2019, there were seven hundred twenty-seven fatalities on Louisiana
19	roadways, with ninety-two occurring on interstates; and
20	WHEREAS, the number of fatalities on Louisiana's roads grew by fourteen percent
21	in 2020; and
22	WHEREAS, bridges on interstates constructed on viaducts or embankments on
23	elevated sections over water bodies, marshes, and subterranean utilities carry high-speed
24	traffic on fixed-width lanes and shoulders; and
25	WHEREAS, the composition of these lanes and shoulders on bridges restrict right-of-
26	way and frequently provide an inadequate clear zone for safe recovery; and
27	WHEREAS, according to the Louisiana Transportation Research Center, Louisiana
28	has approximately two hundred miles of vintage 1960s concrete safety walk bridge rail
29	systems currently in use on Louisiana bridges; and

1	WHEREAS, many of these systems do not meet the current crash performance
2	requirements of the American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials
3	Manual for Assessing Safety Hardware Second Edition specifications; and
4	WHEREAS, a consent decree is a negotiated agreement that is entered as a court
5	order for a legally binding performance improvement plan and typically arises from
6	investigations into misconduct, which can span over a variety of issues; and
7	WHEREAS, the city of New Orleans entered into a consent decree following an
8	investigation by the Department of Justice into civil rights violations and other misconduct;
9	and
10	WHEREAS, the city of Baton Rouge entered into a consent decree with the United
11	States Environmental Protection Agency and the state of Louisiana related to stormwater
12	management; and
13	WHEREAS, the city of Shreveport entered into a consent decree with the Department
14	of Justice and the United States Environmental Protection Agency regarding the city's water
15	and sewer systems.
16	THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the House of Representatives of the
17	Legislature of Louisiana does hereby urge and request the Department of Transportation and
18	Development to establish the Urban Infrastructure Planning Task Force to do the following:
19	(1) Identify the key infrastructure project needs in urban areas.
20	(2) Assess the financial feasibility of all urban infrastructure projects.
21	(3) Assess the potential impacts of urban infrastructure projects.
22	(4) Evaluate the efficiency of urban infrastructure projects.
23	(5) Evaluate ways the urban infrastructure projects improve the quality of life of
24	Louisiana citizens.
25	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Urban Infrastructure Planning Task Force
26	be comprised of the following members:
27	(1) The mayor of the city of New Orleans or his designee.
28	(2) The New Orleans chief engineer or city designer.
29	(3) The mayor of the city of Baton Rouge or his designee.
30	(4) The Baton Rouge city engineer or city designer.

1 (5) The mayor of the city of Shreveport or his designee. 2 (6) The Shreveport city engineer or community planner. 3 (7) The parish president of Jefferson Parish or his designee. 4 (8) The director of the Department of Engineering within the Jefferson Parish 5 Council or his designee. 6 (9) The mayor-president of the city of Lafayette or his designee. 7 (10) The director of the Public Works Department within the Lafayette Consolidated 8 Government. 9 (11) The planning section chiefs or their designees for each corresponding city, 10 excluding Metairie. 11 (12) The chief executive officer of the Midcontinent Independent System Operator 12 or his designee. 13 (13) The chief executive officer of the Southwest Power Pool or his designee. 14 (14) Two graduate students from Southern University A&M College's Department 15 of Civil and Environmental Engineering, selected by the department chair. 16 (15) Two graduate students from Louisiana State University's College of Art and 17 Design, selected by the dean of the college. 18 (16) Two graduate students from the University of Louisiana at Lafayette's School 19 of Architecture and Design, selected by the director of the school. 20 (17) Two graduate students from Grambling State University's Department of Engineering Technology, selected by the department head. 21 22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force shall be staffed by the Department 23 of Transportation and Development as determined by the secretary of the department. 24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Urban Infrastructure Planning Task Force 25 shall submit a written infrastructure report for 2030 to the House Transportation, Highways 26 and Public Works committee by December 13, 2025. 27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Urban Infrastructure Planning Task Force 28 submit a written infrastructure report for 2035 to the House Transportation, Highways and 29 Public Works committee by December 13, 2029, with a mid-range written report submitted 30 by February 13, 2027.

- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Urban Infrastructure Planning Task Force
- 2 submit a written infrastructure report for 2040 to the House Transportation, Highways and
- 3 Public Works committee by December 13, 2034, with a mid-range written report submitted
- 4 by August 13, 2032.
- 5 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be transmitted to the
- 6 secretary of the Department of Transportation and Development.

Requires the Urban Infrastructure Planning Task Force to submit the 2030 written report to the House transportation committee prior to Dec. 13, 2025. Requires the Urban Infrastructure Planning Task Force to submit the 2035 written report to the House transportation committee prior to Dec. 13, 2029, with a mid-range written report submitted by Feb. 13, 2027. Requires the Urban Infrastructure Planning Task Force submit the 2040 written report to the House transportation committee by Dec. 13, 2034, with a mid-range written report submitted by Aug. 13, 2032.
