1	AN ACT
2	To amend and reenact R.S. 33:2491(D)(2)(a) and (H)(2), the introductory paragraph of
3	2494(C)(2) and 2498(C) and to enact R.S. 33:2494.1, relative to the city of
4	Lafayette; to provide relative to the classified police service; to provide relative to
5	certain positions in the classified service; to provide relative to qualifications,
6	selection, and appointment of eligible employees; to provide relative to departmental
7	and promotional seniority and promotion; to provide for an effective date; and to
8	provide for related matters.
9	Notice of intention to introduce this Act has been published.
10	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
11	Section 1. R.S. 33:2491(D)(2)(a) and (H)(2), the introductory paragraph of
12	2494(C)(2) and 2498(C) are hereby amended and reenacted and R.S. 33:2494.1 is hereby
13	enacted to read as follows:
14	§2491. Establishment and maintenance of employment lists
15	Except for the positions of entrance firefighter, entrance police officer,
16	entrance jailer, secretary to the chief, departmental records clerk, and for the entrance
17	classes for which the operation and maintenance of radio, alarm, or signal systems
18	for the respective fire or police service is the primary duty, the board shall establish
19	and maintain employment lists containing names of persons eligible for appointment
20	to the various classes of positions in the classified service, as follows:

24	(2)(a) Names of persons attaining a passing score on the promotional test in

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1	the Lafayette Police Department for the rank of lieutenant or above captain, or in the
2	Lake Charles Police Department, shall be placed upon the promotion employment
3	list for the class for which they were tested, from highest to lowest, according to their
4	total promotional seniority in the next lower class. If two or more persons possess
5	an equal amount of promotional seniority, the names of those persons shall be placed
6	on the promotional list in the order of departmental seniority, from highest to lowest.

10	(2) When new names are to be placed upon a promotion list for a given class
11	in the Lafayette Police Department for the rank of lieutenant or above captain, and
12	in the Lake Charles Police Department, the remaining names thereon shall be
13	rearranged with the new names so that all names appearing upon the list for the class
14	shall rank, from highest to lowest, according to total promotional seniority in the
15	next lower class from which the promotion list is established. If two or more persons
16	possess an equal amount of promotional seniority, the names of those persons shall
17	be placed on the promotional list in the order of departmental seniority, from highest
18	to lowest.

24	(2) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, the municipal
25	fire and police civil service system for the cities of Lafayette for the rank of
26	lieutenant or above <u>captain</u> and Lake Charles shall fill a vacant position in the police
27	department in the following manner:

29	§2494.1. Lafayette Police Department; rank of major
30	A. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, in the city

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1	of Lafayette, a vacant position in the police department at the rank of major
2	shall be filled in the following manner:
3	(1) Any employee who holds the rank of sergeant or above shall be
4	eligible to take the competitive examination for the rank of major.
5	(2) All employees who achieve a passing score on the competitive
6	examination shall be eligible for selection and appointment to the position of
7	major and shall be placed on an eligibility list presented to the chief of police.
8	(3) The chief of police shall select and appoint an employee from the
9	eligibility list to fill the vacant position of major.
10	(4) Eligibility for admission to the competitive examination for the
11	position of major shall be limited to members of the Lafayette Police
12	Department.
13	B.(1) The appointment to the position of major shall be for a term of one
14	year, and the employee holding this position shall be subject to annual review
15	by the chief of police.

5	D. Any employee who is appointed from a position in the classified police
6	service to serve as major shall not forfeit his departmental or promotional
7	seniority accumulated to the date of his appointment. He shall continue to
8	accumulate departmental and promotional seniority in accordance with the
9	provisions of this Part during the time he holds the position of major.
10	E. If a vacancy cannot be filled by reinstatement or by reemployment as
11	provided in this Part, the board shall certify the names of the eligible persons
12	on the promotional list in the order in which they appear for the class in which
13	the vacancy is to be filled.
14	F. If the provisions of this Section conflict with any local ordinance,
15	policy, or restriction regarding the eligibility and appointment process for the
16	rank of major, the provisions of this Section shall govern.
17	G.(1) The provisions of this Section shall apply only to an employee
18	occupying a position at the rank of major or promoted to a position at the rank
19	of major in the Lafayette Police Department when either:
20	(a) The employee occupying the position on July 1, 2025, has not
21	completed the working test period or otherwise has probational status to a
22	position at the rank of major.
23	(b) The appointment is to fill a vacant position at the rank of major that
24	exists on and after July 1, 2025.
25	(2) The provisions of this Section shall not apply to an employee with
26	permanent status to a position at the rank of major in the Lafayette Police
27	Department on July 1, 2025.

29	§2498. Abolition of positions in the classified service
30	* * *

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1	C. Notwithstanding the provisions of Subsection B of this Section, in the
2	Lafayette Police Department for the rank of lieutenant or above captain, and in the
3	Lake Charles Police Department, whenever an entire class is abolished in the
4	classified service, the regular employees of the class shall be demoted to lower
5	classes and priority to positions shall be governed by total promotional seniority
6	earned in the class in the order of highest to lowest. If two or more persons possess
7	an equal amount of promotional seniority, the names of such persons shall be placed
8	on the reinstatement list in the order of departmental seniority, from highest to
9	lowest.

11	Section 2. This Act shall become effective on July 1, 2025; if vetoed by the governor
12	and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become effective on the day
13	following such approval by the legislature or July 1, 2025, whichever is later.
