Subject: Mandatory Retirement of Judges

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(Constitutional Amendment) Provides relative to the mandatory retirement of judges

Current law provides that a judge shall not remain in office beyond his 70th birthday, but also provides that he may remain in office until the completion of his term if he attains 70 years of age while serving a term of office.

Proposed law removes the present constitutional age limitation and provides that a judge shall not remain in office beyond his 75th birthday; provides that a judge who attains 75 years of age while serving a term of office shall be allowed to complete that term of office; provides for the submission of the proposed amendment to the voters at the statewide election to be held 4/18/26.
