SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 184

BY SENATOR CATHEY

COURTS. Urges the Louisiana Supreme Court to take appropriate action to allow full-time legislative staff attorneys to receive eight hours of continuing educaton credits each year.

1	A RESOLUTION
2	To urge and request the Louisiana Supreme Court to take appropriate action to allow full-
3	time legislative staff attorneys who are licensed to practice in the state to receive
4	eight hours of continuing education credit each year for legislative service.
5	WHEREAS, in the Rules of the Supreme Court of Louisiana, the Supreme Court
6	adopted RULE XXX of PART H of the RULES FOR CONTINUING LEGAL
7	EDUCATION; and
8	WHEREAS, Rule 2 of Rule XXX of Part H states "[T]hese Rules shall apply to every
9	attorney licensed to practice law ", and lists certain listed exceptions such as age, residence
10	outside the state and not engaged in the practice of law, or members of Congress; and
11	WHEREAS, Rule 3 of Rule XXX of Part H requires every attorney licensed to
12	practice law is to attend or complete an approved substitute for attendance, a minimum of
13	twelve and one-half hours (12.5) hours of approved continuing legal education (CLE) each
14	calendar year with not less than one (1) of such hours shall concern legal ethics, and not less
15	than one (1) of such hours shall concern professionalism; and
16	WHEREAS, Regulation 3.15 of Rule 3 of Rule XXX of Part H of the Rules of the
17	Supreme Court of Louisiana exempts the governor from these requirements, it further grants
18	eight hours of CLE credit each year to each member of the Louisiana Legislature; to the

- person serving as secretary of the Senate; and to the person serving as clerk of the House of
 Representatives of the Louisiana Legislature; and
- 3 WHEREAS, legislators attend the regular sessions of the legislature as well as 4 extraordinary sessions which may be convened at other times by the governor or by the 5 presiding officers of both houses; and
- 6 WHEREAS, full-time legislative staff attorneys are an integral part of the legislative 7 process performing numerous activities and duties, conducting year-round legal research and 8 bill drafting involving multiple subject areas of the law in proposed legislation, facilitating 9 meetings to educate and brief legislators on the legislative process and the issues and legal 10 knowledge necessary to adequately debate pending legislation; and
- WHEREAS, staff attorneys work with each legislator as they focus on individual
 bills involving different subject matter areas to draft bills, amendments, and provide advice
 as to the proper legislative procedure; and
- WHEREAS, the main goal of a legislative staff attorney is to ensure that legislation
 is clear, concise, legally correct, and provides for good governance; and
- WHEREAS, the number of full-time legislative attorneys for both the House and
 Senate is less than one hundred compared to the nearly nineteen thousand licensed attorneys
 in the state; and
- WHEREAS, considering that legislative staff attorneys conduct research and draft
 legislation that ultimately becomes law in our state, these attorneys should receive CLE
 credit for their knowledge and work in the legislative process.
- THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Senate of the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby urge and request the Supreme Court of Louisiana to take appropriate action to allow full-time legislative staff attorneys who are licensed to practice law in this state to receive eight hours of CLE credit each year similar to that provided in Regulation 3.15 of Rule XXX of Part H of the Rules of the Supreme Court of Louisiana for legislators and the legislative chief clerical officers.
