SUMMARY OF HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO THE SENATE BILL

- 1. Make technical amendments.
- 2. Change the requirement to consider local government comments <u>from</u> the commissioner of conservation <u>to</u> the secretary of the Dept. of Energy and Conservation.
- 3. Provides that a certificate of public convenience and necessity issued to a transporter of carbon dioxide prior to effective date shall remain valid.

DIGEST OF THE SENATE BILL AS RETURNED TO THE SENATE

<u>Present law</u> provides for the jurisdiction of the commissioner of conservation over the geologic sequestration of carbon dioxide.

<u>Proposed law</u> maintains <u>present law</u> and changes commissioner to secretary. Further requires the secretary to give substantial consideration to local government comments when determining the appropriate course of action in any matter that requires a public comment period or hearing.

<u>Present law</u> provides for issuance of certificates of public convenience and necessity and certificates of completion of injection operations, after public hearing and satisfaction of certain requirements.

<u>Proposed law</u> maintains <u>present law</u> and provides that a certificate of public convenience and necessity issued to a transporter of carbon dioxide prior to the effective date of <u>proposed law</u>, shall remain valid.

Effective August 1, 2025.
