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Provides relative to minors use of applications

<u>Proposed law</u> provides relative to applications stores and developers in regards to minors; provides for what a covered application store provider shall do at the time an individual creates an account, including age verification, receiving notices of a significant change from or providing information to a developer, revocation of parental consent, and protecting personal age verification data; provides that a developer shall use the lowest age indicated by age verification data provided in implementing any developer-created safety-related features or defaults; provides that for purposes of setting the age category of an application and providing content description disclosure to a covered application store provider, a developer complies with the <u>proposed law</u> if the developer uses widely adopted industry standards for age categories and content description disclosures and if the developer applies those standards consistently and in good faith; provides the Attorney General (AG) with the authority to bring a civil action to enforce any violations; provides that a social media platform that violates the <u>proposed law</u> shall be subject to a fine of up to \$10,000 per violation set by the AG; provides for civil penalties of no more than \$5,000 set by the AG for those who violate administrative or court orders; provides for when the AG may give notice to initiate a civil action to secure a judgment or injunctive relief against a person who fails to cure a violation; effective 7/01/26.

## **EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION**

There is no anticipated direct material effect on governmental expenditures as a result of this measure. While the <u>proposed law</u> may result in an indeterminable increase in workload in the Office of the Attorney General (AG), the department reports that any fiscal impact will be absorbed within its operating budget.

## **REVENUE EXPLANATION**

<u>Proposed law</u> may result in an indeterminable increase in Self-Generated Revenue in the Office of the Attorney General, to the extent that the AG collects civil fines imposed on a person who violates an administrative or court order issued under the <u>proposed law</u>, or a covered application store or developer that violates the <u>proposed law</u>. The exact impact to Self-Generated Revenue is indeterminable, as it is unknown the number of instances in which the AG will successfully secure civil fines related to litigation under the <u>proposed law</u>.
