DOMESTIC ABUSE: Increases the penalties for certain domestic violence offenses that involve strangulation

1 AN ACT

2 To amend and reenact R.S. 14:34.9(L)(1) and 35.3(L)(1), relative to certain domestic
3 violence offenses; to provide relative to the maximum penalty when the offense
4 involves strangulation; and to provide for related matters.

5 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

6 Section 1. R.S. 14:34.9(L)(1) and 35.3(L)(1) are hereby amended and reenacted to
7 read as follows:

8 §34.9. Battery of a dating partner

15 §35.3. Domestic abuse battery

17 L.(1) Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, if the domestic
18 abuse battery involves strangulation, the offender, in addition to any other penalties
19 imposed pursuant to this Section, shall be imprisoned at hard labor for not more than
20 three ten years.

Abstract: Increases the penalties for certain domestic violence offenses that involve strangulation.

Present law (R.S. 14:34.9) provides for the crime of battery of a dating partner.

Proposed law retains present law.

Present law provides that if the battery of a dating partner involves strangulation, the offender, in addition to any other penalties imposed pursuant to present law, shall be imprisoned at hard labor for not more than three years.

Proposed law amends present law to change the maximum penalty from three years to 10 years. Otherwise retains present law.

Present law (R.S. 14:35.3) provides for the crime of domestic abuse battery.

Proposed law retains present law.

Present law provides that if the domestic abuse battery involves strangulation, the offender, in addition to any other penalties imposed pursuant to present law, shall be imprisoned at hard labor for not more than three years.

Proposed law amends present law to change the maximum penalty from three years to 10 years. Otherwise retains present law.
