SENATE BILL NO. 123

BY SENATOR MORRIS

GOVERNOR. Constitutional amendment to allow the governor to recommend the suspension or removal of a district attorney and certain judges under certain circumstances. (2/3 - CA13s1(A))

A JOINT RESOLUTION

Proposing to amend Article IV, Section 5(I) of the Constitution of Louisiana, relative to gubernatorial removal authority; to provide for the issuance of an executive order suspending a district attorney or a district, juvenile, family, or municipal court judge under certain circumstances; to provide for removal of the suspended official by the Senate; and to specify an election for submission of the proposition to electors and provide a ballot proposition.

Section 1. Be it resolved by the Legislature of Louisiana, two-thirds of the members elected to each house concurring, that there shall be submitted to the electors of the state, for their approval or rejection in the manner provided by law, a proposal to amend Article IV, Section 5(I) of the Constitution of Louisiana, to read as follows:

§5. Governor; Powers and Duties

Section 5.(A) \* \* \*

(I) Removal Power. The governor may ~~remove from office a~~ **by executive order:**

**(1) Remove from office a** person he appoints, except a person appointed for a term fixed by this constitution or by law.

Present constitution allows the governor to remove from office a person he appointed unless that person is appointed for a term fixed by either present constitution or present law.

Proposed constitutional amendment retains present constitution.

Proposed constitutional amendment allows the governor to issue an executive order recommending either the suspension or both the suspension and removal of a district attorney or a district, juvenile, family, or municipal court judge for malfeasance, gross misconduct, or incompetence while in office. Proposed constitutional amendment also provides that a suspension must be with pay and for no longer than six months.

Proposed constitutional amendment provides that the Senate may, by a two-thirds majority vote, affirm the recommended suspension. Proposed constitutional amendment also provides that the vote may be taken by written ballot.

Proposed constitutional amendment provides that if the executive order recommends suspension and removal, and the suspension is affirmed, any member of the Senate may make a motion to remove the suspended official. If the motion passes the Senate by a simple majority vote, the Senate must conduct a trial according to the rules of the Senate.

Proposed constitutional amendment provides that, following a trial, the Senate may vote to remove the suspended official. Upon a two-thirds majority vote of the Senate, the official is removed from office.

Proposed constitutional amendment provides that a district attorney or a district, juvenile, family, or municipal court judge who is removed is permanently barred from seeking any judicial office in the state of Louisiana.

Specifies submission of the amendment to the voters at the statewide election to be held on April 17, 2027, as authorized by law.
