Abstract: Requires a person charged with domestic abuse battery to be held without bail for at least 48 hours but not more than 72 hours.

Present law provides relative to bail in domestic abuse battery matters, violations of protective orders, stalking, and any felony offense involving the use or threatened use of force against a family member.

Present law provides for a contradictory bail hearing and conditions under which bail may be granted.

Proposed law retains present law.

Proposed law provides that regardless of whether the court grants a contradictory hearing, a person charged with the crimes listed in present law (C.Cr.P. Art. 313) shall be held without bail between 48 and 72 hours.
