MTR VEHICLE/LICEN PLATES: Creates the "Classic Black" specialty license plate

1 AN ACT

2 To amend and reenact R.S. 47:463.243, relative to motor vehicle special prestige license
3 plates; to establish the "Classic Black" special prestige license plate; to provide for
4 the creation, issuance, design, fees, distribution, and rule promulgation applicable to
5 the license plate; and to provide for related matters.

6 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

7 Section 1. R.S. 47:463.243 is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

8 §463.243. Special prestige license plate; Classic Black plate

9 A. The secretary of the Department of Public Safety and Corrections shall
10 establish a special prestige motor vehicle license plate to be known as the "Classic
11 Black" plate, provided that there is a minimum of one thousand applicants for such
12 plate. The plate shall be restricted to use on passenger cars, pickup trucks,
13 recreational vehicles, motorcycles, and vans.

14 B. The design shall display white alpha-numeric series of the license plate
15 numbers on a black background in compliance with R.S. 47:463(A)(3). The design
16 shall include a white border with "LOUISIANA" centered at the top of the plate.

17 C. The special prestige license plate shall be issued, upon application, to any
18 citizen of Louisiana in the same manner as any other motor vehicle license plate.

19 D. The department shall collect an annual royalty fee of twenty-five dollars
20 that shall be disbursed in accordance with Subsection E of this Section. This royalty

1 fee shall be in addition to the standard motor vehicle license tax imposed by Article
 2 VII, Section 5 of the Constitution of Louisiana and a handling fee of three dollars
 3 and fifty cents for each plate to be retained by the department to offset a portion of
 4 administrative costs.

5 E. The annual royalty fee shall be collected by the department and forwarded
 6 to the Donald J. Thibodeaux Training Center in Holden, Louisiana. The monies
 7 received from the royalty fees shall be used for emergency vehicle operations
 8 training for local governments pursuant to R.S. 40:1375.

9 F. The secretary shall promulgate and adopt rules and regulations as are
 10 necessary to implement the provisions of this Section.

11 Section 2. The Department of Public Safety and Corrections, office of motor
 12 vehicles, is hereby directed to create this special license plate when applicable statutory
 13 provisions are met and its system is updated to accommodate the creation of the new plate.

Abstract: Creates the "Classic Black" special prestige license plate and provides for the creation, issuance, design, implementation, fees, distributions, and rule promulgation applicable to this license plate.

Proposed law requires the Dept. of Public Safety and Corrections (DPS&C), office of motor vehicles (OMV), issue a special prestige license plate to be known as the "Classic Black" license plate, provided that there is a minimum of 1,000 applicants for such plates.

Proposed law specifies that the plate is restricted to use on passenger cars, pickup trucks, recreational vehicles, motorcycles, and vans.

Proposed law requires the plate to display white alpha-numeric series of the license plate numbers on a black background. Requires the design include a white border with "LOUISIANA" centered at the top of the plate.

Proposed law specifies that the plate will be issued, upon application, to any citizen of the state in the same manner as any other motor vehicle license plate.

Proposed law requires a one-time fee of \$25 in addition to the standard motor vehicle license tax imposed in present law and a handling fee of \$3.50 for each plate to be retained by the dept. to offset a portion of administrative costs.

Proposed law requires the annual royalty fee collected by the dept. and forwarded to the Donald J. Thibodeaux Training Center in Holden, La. Further requires the monies received from the royalty fees be used for emergency vehicle operations training for local governments pursuant to present law.

Proposed law requires the secretary promulgate and adopt rules and regulations as are necessary to implement the provision of proposed law.

Directs the DPS&C, OMV, to create this special prestige license plate when the applicable statutory provisions are met and its system is updated to accommodate the creation of the new plate.
