Provides relative to the supervised release of sex offenders

Current law provides for the duty of the court and law enforcement relative to informing an offender of the sex offender registration and notification requirements; requires the court to notify the Bureau of Criminal Identification and Information of the conviction of a sex offender who is not sentenced to incarceration; assesses a fine of no more than \$1,000 and imprisonment for no less than two nor more than ten years, with hard labor, without benefit of parole, probation, or suspension of sentence, for persons who fail to comply with conditions of supervised release, and upon second or subsequent conviction, a fine of \$3,000 and imprisonment for no less than five years nor more than 20 years without benefit of probation, parole, or suspension of sentence; provides for venue for a trial is where the offense is committed. Proposed law requires the court to provide a copy of the notification to sex offender form to the Department of Public Safety and Corrections-Probation and Parole; adds reference to the duty to inform the offender of requirements of conditions of supervised release; adds a provision relative to lifetime supervision for a sex offense involving a victim 13 years of age or under which requires compliance with conditions of supervised release; adds that a prosecution for failure to comply with conditions of supervised release may occur in the parish where the violation occurred, and other venue provisions.
