Provides with respect to the advisory board created to recommend new treatments for rare cancers

Proposed legislation increases the membership of the Rare Cancer Advisory Board from 15 to 17 members by expanding the number of oncologists specializing in rare cancer treatment from two to four. Proposed law extends the timeframe for the Rare Cancer Advisory Board to compile and submit its findings from 30 to 45 days following each quarterly public meeting and requires that these findings be submitted as a formal written report to the House and Senate Committees on Insurance.
