2026 Regular Session

Substitute for Original House Bill No. 541 by Representative LaCombe as proposed by the House Committee on Judiciary

This document reflects the content of a substitute bill but is not in a bill form; page numbers in this document DO NOT correspond to page numbers in the substitute bill itself.

1 To enact R.S. 26:71(A)(8), relative to a manufacturing distiller; to provide for a permit; to
2 provide for the cost of a permit; and to provide for related matters.

3 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

4 Section 1. R.S. 26:71(A)(8) is hereby enacted to read as follows:

5 §71. Permits required; fees; exception

6 A. Except as provided in Subsections B and C of this Section, before
7 engaging in the business of manufacturing, supplying, or dealing in alcoholic
8 beverages, all persons shall obtain from the commissioner, according to established
9 rules and regulations, a permit to conduct each separate business and shall pay the
10 commissioner a fee not to exceed the amounts provided for in the following schedule
11 and in accordance with regulations promulgated pursuant to the provisions of the
12 Administrative Procedure Act for each year the permit is valid:

13 * * *

14 (8) In-state manufacturing distillers that distill less than one hundred gallons

15 - one hundred dollars.

HB Draft 2026 Regular Session

Abstract: Provides relative to permits for in-state manufacturing distillers producing less than 100 gallons.

Present law provides that the commissioner of the office of alcohol and tobacco control may issue a permit for a fee to entities in the business of manufacturing, supplying, or dealing in alcoholic beverages.

Proposed law retains present law and provides that an in-state manufacturing distiller that distills less than 100 gallons may receive a permit for a fee of \$100.
