Subject: Supplemental Pay for Probation and Parole Officers		

SUPPLEMENTAL PAY OR +\$6,264,000 GF EX See Note Page 1 of 1

Provides supplemental pay to persons employed by the Department of Public Safety and Corrections as a probation or parole officer

Proposed legislation provides extra compensation of \$600 per month to a person employed as a probation or parole officer who is a commissioned law enforcement officer employed full-time by the Dept. of Public Safety and Corrections. Proposed law requires a probation and parole officer to complete and pass a P.O.S.T.-certified training program and complete one year of service in order to be eligible to receive the extra compensation. Proposed measure allows prior service as a full-time deputy sheriff or law enforcement officer with a municipality, tribe, or policy agency of the state or political subdivision to count toward the one-year eligibility requirement.

A companion bill (HB 581) will provide for a constitutional amendment to be placed on the ballot for an upcoming statewide election.

EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION

Proposed legislation will increase SGF expenditures by \$3.1 M in FY 27, annualized in future fiscal years, in Schedule 20-966 Supplemental Pay, as a result of adding probation and parole officers to the list of public employees that receive state supplemental pay. Each eligible probation and parole officer would receive \$600 per month or \$7,200 annually (\$600 per month x 12 months). Currently, the number of full-time probation and parole officers employed by DPS&C is 650. The Office of Juvenile Justice (OJJ) has 220 probation and parole officer positions. Under the proposed law, if all 870 probation and parole officers are eligible to receive supplemental pay, the cost would be \$6,264,000 annually (870 probation and parole officers x \$7,200).

Note: The constitutional amendment is in companion bill HB 581. If HB 581 is enacted into law, the constitutional amendment on probation and parole officers receiving state supplemental pay will be on the official ballot for the 11/03/26 statewide election.

Secretary of State

In certain circumstances, the Secretary of State may incur minimal ballot processing costs associated with this measure. As a regular practice, the department budgets for up to 10 constitutional amendments and statewide propositions for the fall statewide elections. To the extent the ballot includes more than 10 constitutional amendments and statewide propositions, the Secretary of State may require additional SGF resources for the 11/03/26 statewide election. Any expenditure impact would be realized in FY 27.

REVENUE EXPLANATION

There is no anticipated direct material effect on governmental revenues as a result of this measure.
