CIVIL/PROCEDURE: Extends the time delay for filing of oppositions to motions for summary judgment.

DIGEST

Present law permits the court, with agreement by all the parties, to extend the time delay for filings for motions for summary judgment.

Proposed law retains present law but removes language that requires the parties to agree to an extension for a time delay regarding motions for summary judgment.

(Amends C.C.P. Art. 966(B)(intro. para.) and (C)(1)(intro. para.))

Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

The House Floor Amendments to the engrossed bill:

1. Remove proposed language that changes the time delay to file an opposition to the motion for summary judgment.
2. Authorize the court to determine an extension on a time delay to file an opposition or other filings regarding motions for summary judgment without agreement from the involved parties.
3. Make technical changes.

Summary of Amendments Adopted by Senate

Committee Amendments Proposed by Senate Committee on Judiciary A to the reengrossed bill

1. Clarify that a motion for summary judgment shall be filed, opposed, or replied to in accordance with the law unless extended by the court and agreed to by all of the parties.
2. Change the legal delay that any opposition to the motion for summary judgment and all documents in support of the opposition shall be filed and served in accordance with present law (Code of Civil Procedure Article 1313(A)(4)) from not less than 15 days to not less than 10 days prior to the hearing of the motion.
3. Make technical changes.
