Constitutional amendment to allow for the use of public funds to replace drinking water utility service lines located on private property. (2/3 - CA13s1(A))

Proposed constitutional amendment provides for the use of public funds by a political subdivision for the purpose of identifying, inventorying, removing or replacing drinking water utility service lines made of or affected by hazardous materials including but not limited to, lead, copper, galvanized steel, or iron, on property owned by utility customers.

To be submitted to the electors at the statewide election to be held on November 3, 2026.

**EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION**

Proposed constitutional amendment may increase local fund expenditures for political subdivisions. The proposed constitutional amendment provides for the use of public funds by a political subdivision for the purpose of remedying drinking water utility service lines on private property for lines that are made of or affected by hazardous materials. To the extent that political subdivisions use public funds to remedy drinking water utility service lines, a corresponding increase in expenditures will occur.

In certain circumstances, the Secretary of State may incur minimal ballot processing costs associated with this measure. As a regular practice, the department budgets for up to 10 constitutional amendments and statewide propositions for the fall statewide elections. To the extent the ballot includes more than 10 constitutional amendments and statewide propositions, the Secretary of State may require additional SGF resources for the 11/03/26 statewide election. Any expenditure impact would be realized in FY 27.
