Authorizes the Louisiana Commission on Law Enforcement and the Administration of Criminal Justice to establish a grant program for pursuit intervention technologies

Proposed law creates the Law Enforcement Pursuit Safety and Technology Grant Program within the Louisiana Commission on Law Enforcement and Administration of Criminal Justice (LCLE) for the development of training and technology to safely terminate high-speed vehicle pursuits; requires the commission to administer the program based on the uniform guidelines promulgated by the commission; requires the funds be used for pursuit intervention training or the purchase of pursuit intervention technology and devices to enhance pursuit safety, including but not limited to GPS tracking projectiles, vehicle-stopping nets or tethering systems, such as the Grappler, and remote-controlled tire deflation devices; authorizes the commission to receive funds, grants, donations, or other assistance from any source, including federal funds and funds from the Louisiana Department of Transportation and Development for purposes of the program; requires the commission prioritize grant applications from agencies that have integrated pursuit technologies into policy that emphasize law enforcement safety by reducing manual deployment risks; establishes the Pursuit Safety and Officer Technology Fund and that the treasurer shall deposit into the fund monies transferred, appropriated, and dedicated to the fund, and that the fund shall be appropriated by the treasurer to LCLE; is designated as the "Sergeant Grant Candies Officer Safety Act".

EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION

There is no anticipated direct material effect on governmental expenditures as a result of this measure.

The requirements of the proposed law are already included within responsibilities of LCLE staff that serve the administrative function for grant programs across the criminal justice system. As LCLE intends to retain existing staff to administer grant programs associated with the new Pursuit Safety and Officer Technology Fund, and because the fund allows for potential administrative costs not to exceed 5% of the annual fund balance, there is no anticipated impact to governmental expenditures.
