

1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that such reports shall be prepared separately by each
2 Quality Improvement Network (QN), the Louisiana Quality Network (LQN), and each
3 Medicaid managed care organization (MCO) participating in the MCIP program in this state.

4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that each report shall be submitted to LDH and
5 transmitted by LDH to the House and Senate committees on health and welfare, the Joint
6 Legislative Committee on the Budget, and the David R. Poynter Legislative Research
7 Library.

8 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that each report shall include, at a minimum, all of
9 the following:

10 (1) The total amount of incentive payments received, distributed, retained, or
11 recaptured through the MCIP program.

12 (2) Identification of participating hospital networks and participating hospitals.

13 (3) Performance results for MCIP measures, including baseline performance,
14 established targets, and current results on all initiatives.

15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the purpose of this Resolution is to ensure that
16 the legislature receives timely, consistent, and comprehensive information regarding the
17 performance of the MCIP program and the use of incentive funds, thereby enhancing
18 oversight between formal audit cycles.

19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be transmitted to the
20 secretary of the Louisiana Department of Health.

Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

The Committee Amendments Proposed by House Committee on Health and Welfare to the original bill:

1. Remove requirement for in-person briefing by quality networks to the House and Senate committees on health and welfare.
